
NEW YORK EXPORTED \$565 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$76M in roasted coffee
- → \$48M in non-alcohol beverages
- → \$47M in breads and pastries
- → \$45M in animal feed
- → \$34M in fruit and vegetable juices

NEW YORK IMPORTED \$1.3 BILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$113M in pork
- → \$101M in beef
- → \$79M in frozen fries
- → \$75M in beer
- → \$66M in breads and pastries

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION, AND EFFICIENCIES

New York is the third most populous state, yet 27^{th} in size. To meet the population's agriculture and agri-food needs in 2010, New York State imported \$101 million worth of fresh beef and \$113 million in pork from Canada. Meanwhile, New York helped feed Canadian livestock by exporting \$45 million in animal feed to Canada. This trade ensures that each animal is well fed and that the state of New York is supplied with quality beef and pork products.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN NEW YORK

→ Approximately 517,000 jobs (or 1 in 18 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
