# AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$2.3 BILLION IN 2012 Let's keep a good thing growing! 

New York exported \$747 million to Canada, including:
$\rightarrow$ \$122M in roasted coffee
$\rightarrow \$ 56 \mathrm{M}$ in breads and pastries
$\rightarrow$ \$49M in sauces and condiments (including \$31M in tomato sauce)
$\rightarrow \$ 44 \mathrm{M}$ in food preparations (including $\$ 9 \mathrm{M}$ in flavoring powders)
$\rightarrow$ \$42M in non-alcoholic beverages
New York imported \$1.6 billion from Canada, including:
$\rightarrow \$ 131 \mathrm{M}$ in vegetables and legumes (including \$16M in potatoes)
$\rightarrow \$ 98 \mathrm{M}$ in fresh/frozen pork
$\rightarrow$ \$89M in fresh/frozen beef
$\rightarrow \$ 85 \mathrm{M}$ in fats and oils (including \$35M in soybean oil)
$\rightarrow \$ 79 \mathrm{M}$ in breads and pastries (including \$14M in cookies)

## A Strong Partnership in Trade:

Canada purchased \$21 billion in U.S. agriculture and agri-food products in 2012.
New York benefitted from this strong relationship in 2012 by exporting $\$ 747$ million in agriculture and agri-food products to Canada. To help reduce barriers to trade, lower costs and create economic opportunities, the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border Action Plans were released in December 2011. Increased regulatory cooperation will support U.S.-Canada trade in agriculture and agri-food products, contribute to job creation, and provide a greater variety of safe, high-quality food products for consumers.

Trade with Canada = Jobs in New York
$\rightarrow$ Approximately 517,000 jobs in New York depend on trade with Canada.
