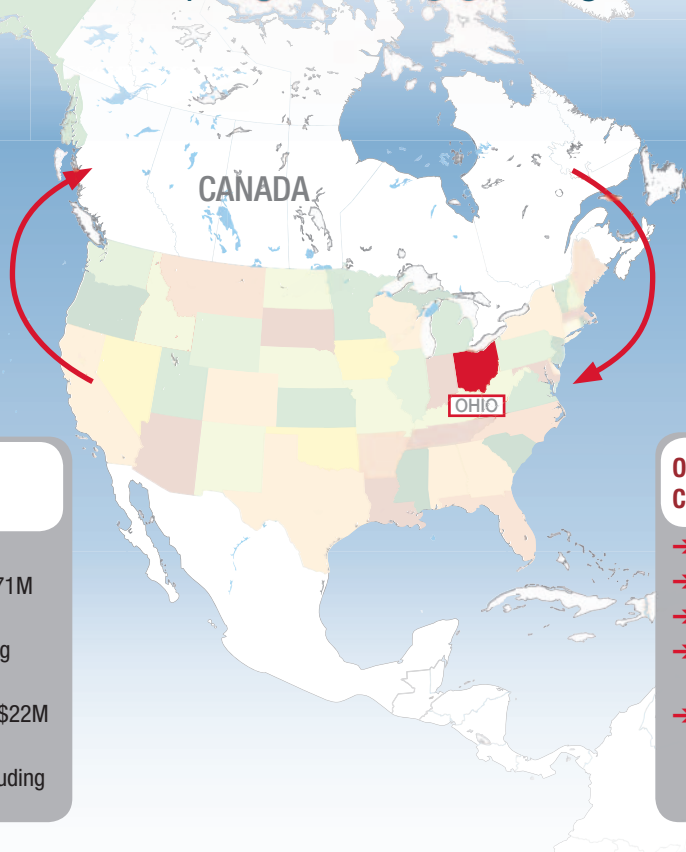


# OHIO-CANADA

**AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$1.7 BILLION IN 2012**

*Let's keep a good thing growing!*



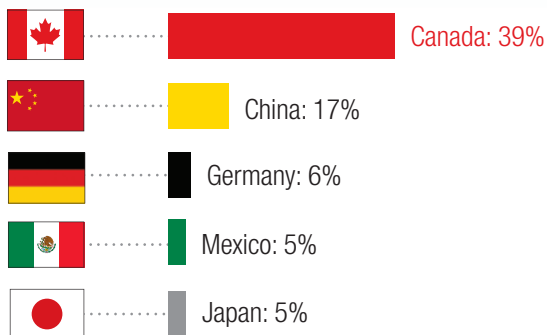
**Ohio exported \$692 million to Canada, including:**

- \$100M in animal/pet feed
- \$87M in prepared meats (including \$71M in prepared pork)
- \$85M in breads and pastries (including \$26M in corn chips and snacks)
- \$43M in food preparations (including \$22M in microwavable popcorn)
- \$36M in sauces and condiments (including \$6M in tomato ketchup)

**Ohio imported \$978 million from Canada, including:**

- \$126M in canola oil
- \$99M in fresh/frozen pork
- \$78M in non-durum wheat
- \$76M in breads and pastries (including \$24M in cookies)
- \$54M in soups and broths

**A Strong Partnership in Trade:**

Canada purchased \$21 billion in U.S. agriculture and agri-food products in 2012. Ohio benefitted from this strong relationship in 2012 by exporting \$692 million in agriculture and agri-food products to Canada. To help reduce barriers to trade, lower costs and create economic opportunities, the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border Action Plans were released in December 2011. Increased regulatory cooperation will support U.S.-Canada trade in agriculture and agri-food products, contribute to job creation, and provide a greater variety of safe, high-quality food products for consumers.

**Trade with Canada = Jobs in Ohio**

→ Approximately 301,000 jobs in Ohio depend on trade with Canada.

All currency is in U.S. dollars and based on 2012 data (as of July 2013).  
All export figures do not include re-export values.  
Trade values are approximate and have been rounded where/when appropriate.  
Fertilizers, farm machinery and seafood are not included in the definition of agriculture and agri-food trade.  
Commodity categories are based on the internationally standardized Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS codes).  
Wherein a single commodity is 90 percent or more of an HS group, the specific commodity is named.
