


**OKLAHOMA EXPORTED
\$38 MILLION TO CANADA,
INCLUDING:**

- \$9M in proteins
- \$5M in ground nuts
- \$4M in breads and pastries
- \$3M in chocolate products
- \$3M in prepared beef

**OKLAHOMA IMPORTED
\$48 MILLION FROM CANADA,
INCLUDING:**

- \$22M in beef
- \$6M in breads and pastries
- \$1M in cattle
- \$0.6M in tomatoes
- \$0.5M in cucumbers and gherkins

OKLAHOMA'S TOP AGRICULTURAL EXPORT MARKETS



BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION, AND EFFICIENCIES

The meat industries in Oklahoma and Canada demonstrate the benefits of a strong, integrated bilateral trading relationship. Canada exported \$22 million worth of beef to Oklahoma. Meanwhile, Oklahoma exported \$3 million in prepared and preserved beef to Canada. While Oklahoma is also a beef producer, imports of beef trimmings from Canada allow for greater profitability for the state, as Oklahoma can mix their ground beef with Canadian beef trimmings to satisfy a wide array of consumer preferences.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN OKLAHOMA

- Approximately 93,500 jobs (or 1 in 18 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
