
Oregon exported \$352 million to Canada, including:

- → \$47M in fruits and nuts (including \$13M in hazelnuts)
- → \$40M in live plants
- → \$38M in seeds (including \$11M in rye grass seeds)
- → \$30M in prepared potatoes
- \$27M in vegetables and legumes (including \$11M in onions)

Oregon imported \$407 million from Canada, including:

- → \$96M in non-durum wheat
- → \$48M in canola oil
- → \$38M in vegetables and legumes (including \$13M in mushrooms)
- → \$26M in fruits and nuts (including \$16M in frozen blueberries)
- → \$21M in live animals (including \$18M in hogs)

Oregon's top agriculture and agri-food export markets:



A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Oregon, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$352 million came from Oregon.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
