## AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$9 MILLION IN 2010

*Let's keep a good thing growing!*



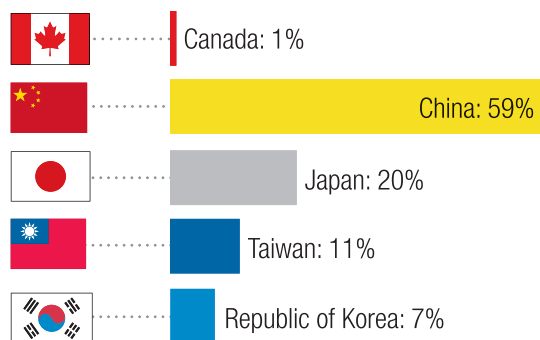
### ALASKA EXPORTED \$0.8 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$0.3M in fish fats and oils
- \$0.1M in animal feed
- \$0.05M in rice
- \$0.05M in mushrooms and truffles
- \$0.04M in food preparations

### ALASKA IMPORTED \$8 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$4M in animal feed
- \$2M in non-roasted malt
- \$0.8M in live plants
- \$0.2M in vegetables
- \$0.2M in food preparations

### BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION, AND EFFICIENCIES

One of Alaska's most valuable agricultural products is cattle. To feed this livestock, Alaska imported \$4 million worth of animal feed from Canada in 2010. The bilateral trading relationship between Alaska and Canada ensures that both places can further develop their areas of specialization; Canada has a market for their animal feed, and Alaska will continue to generate income from their cattle.

### TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN ALASKA

- Approximately 20,000 jobs (or 1 in 16 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
