

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, AND EFFICIENCIES

Bilateral trade has allowed residents of both Pennsylvania and Canada to satisfy their sweet tooth. In 2010, bilateral trade in chocolate products and sugar confectionery was more than \$370 million, accounting for 20% of all agricultural trade. An additional \$170 million worth of breads and pastries were exchanged, making sweets and desserts key commodities in our trading partnership. This partnership ensures that both Pennsylvania and Canada can further develop their areas of specialization and supply each other with high quality sweets.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN PENNSYLVANIA

→ Approximately 330,600 jobs (or 1 in 18 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
