
Pennsylvania exported \$823 million to Canada, including:

- → \$110M in chocolate products
- \$90M in breads and pastries (including \$16M in cookies)
- → \$79M in roasted coffee
- → \$51M in pasta
- → \$46M in cocoa paste

Pennsylvania imported \$1.6 billion from Canada, including:

- → \$217M in chocolate products
- → \$170M in live cattle
- → \$141M in breads and pastries (including \$58M in biscuits)
- → \$105M in candy
- → \$79M in vegetables and legumes (including \$11M in potatoes)

Pennsylvania's top agriculture and agri-food export markets:



A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Pennsylvania, has benefited from this strong relationship

 with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from
 the U.S. in 2013, of which \$823 million came from Pennsylvania.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
