
### **Rhode Island exported \$5 million** to Canada, including:

- → \$3M in sausages
- → \$0.3M in breads and pastries
- → \$0.3M in cured pork
- → \$0.2M in sauces and condiments
- → \$0.2M in food preparations

## **Rhode Island imported \$26 million** from Canada, including:

- → \$9M in fresh/frozen pork
- → \$4M in pet feed
- → \$3M in vegetables and legumes (including \$1M in potatoes)
- → \$1M in maple syrup
- → \$1M in live plants

#### A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Rhode Island, has benefited from this strong relationship - with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$5 million came from Rhode Island.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
