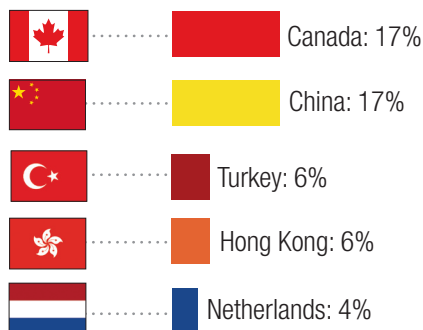
**SOUTH CAROLINA EXPORTED
\$86 MILLION TO CANADA,
INCLUDING:**

- \$18 million in animal feed
- \$10 million in live poultry
- \$8 million in chicken
- \$6 million in food preparations
- \$5 million in pasta

**SOUTH CAROLINA IMPORTED
\$122 MILLION FROM CANADA,
INCLUDING:**

- \$23 million in durum wheat
- \$17 million in breads and pastries
- \$14 million in chocolate products
- \$9 million in gelatin
- \$4 million in whiskey

SOUTH CAROLINA'S TOP AGRICULTURAL EXPORT MARKETS



BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION AND EFFICIENCIES

South Carolina imported \$23 million in durum wheat from Canada, the leading exporter of durum wheat in the world. South Carolina's processing plants turn the durum wheat into a number of products, including pasta, which is then exported to Canada. Trade enables integration of the pasta and wheat industries allowing both Canada and South Carolina to play to their strengths, promoting specialization and increased efficiencies.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN SOUTH CAROLINA

- Approximately 114,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
