
### TENNESSEE EXPORTED \$202 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$43M in breads and pastries
- → \$19M in animal feed
- → \$19M in ketchup
- → \$15M in whiskey
- → \$11M in sunflower seed oil

#### TENNESSEE IMPORTED \$409 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$159M in canola oil
- → \$41M in mixes and dough
- → \$34M in food preparations
- → \$25M in sugar confectionery
- → \$21M in breads and pastries

# BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION AND EFFICIENCIES

The integration of Tennessee-Canada supply chains is at the heart of our successful trading relationship in agriculture. One example is the preparation of baking materials. In 2010, Tennessee imported \$41 million of Canadian mixes and dough, and exported \$43 million of breads and pastries back to Canada. The bilateral trading relationship between Tennessee and Canada ensures that both can further develop their areas of specialization and can supply each other with high quality agricultural products.

#### TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN TENNESSEE

→ Approximately 164,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
