
### AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$640 MILLION IN 2014 Let's keep a good thing growing!

## Tennessee exported \$254 million to Canada, including:

- → \$62M in baked goods
- → \$35M in chocolate products
- → \$29M in prepared cereal grains (including breakfast cereal)
- → \$18M in beverages (including \$13M in whiskies)
   → \$16M in animal feed
  - (including \$15M in dog and cat food)

# Tennessee imported \$386 million from Canada, including:

- → \$103M in fats and oils (including \$71M in canola oil)
- → \$51M in mixes and doughs
- → \$50M in food preparations\*
- → \$34M in sugar and candy
- → \$33M in coffee

### A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since 2005, agriculture and agri-food trade between the U.S. and Canada has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S. and, in particular, Tennessee has benefited from this strong relationship - with Canada purchasing over \$26B in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2014, of which \$254M came from Tennessee.
- Supply chains that cross our shared border are cost-effective and efficient because
  of the proximity to each other's agricultural inputs and products. For example, Canada
  is a major supplier of energy and fertilizers, while the U.S. equips Canada with farm
  machinery and crop protection technologies.
- Access to Canadian cattle, hogs, and oilseeds allows American feedlots, finishers, and crushing plants to run at capacity, supporting U.S. jobs.
