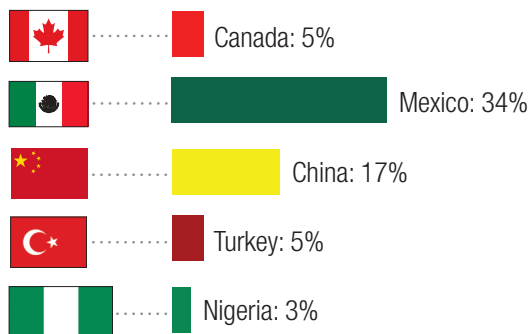
TEXAS EXPORTED \$376 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$65M in beef
- \$35M in coffee extracts
- \$31M in vegetables
- \$21M in preserved fruits and nuts
- \$21M in food preparations

TEXAS IMPORTED \$451 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$62M in frozen fries
- \$60M in breads and pastries
- \$37M in canola oil
- \$36M in beef
- \$19M in whiskey

TEXAS' TOP AGRICULTURAL EXPORT MARKETS



BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Texas is the second-largest agricultural state in the United States, accounting for about 7% of the total U.S. agricultural income. It is also the third largest exporter of agricultural commodities, with one of the top exports being red meat. In 2010, Texas' top export to Canada was fresh and frozen beef. It is important to keep a strong bilateral trading relationship between Texas and Canada because Canada is one of Texas' top export markets for beef, and is Texas' top export market for coffee extracts.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN TEXAS

- Approximately 625,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada
