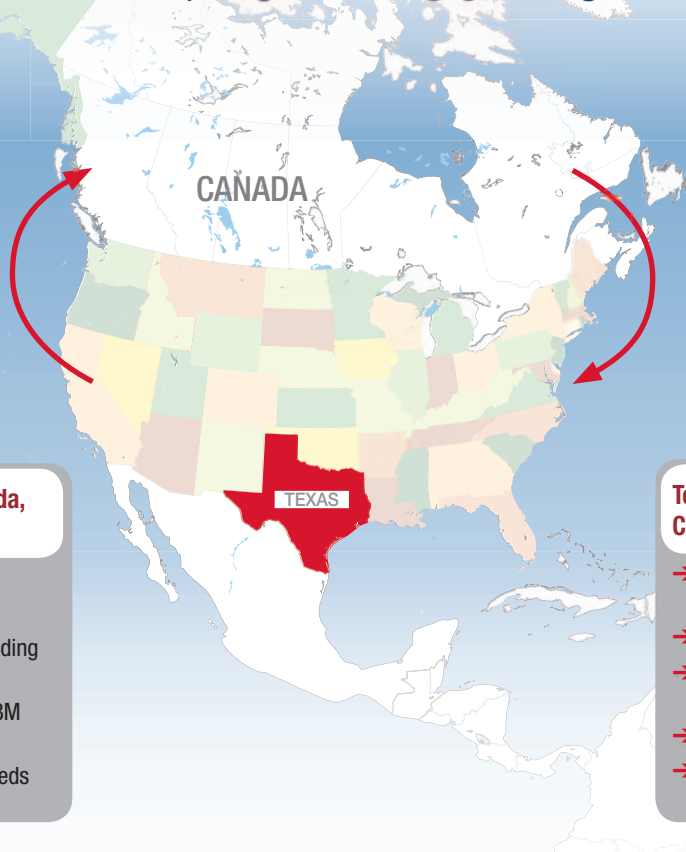


TEXAS-CANADA

AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$1.3 BILLION IN 2012

Let's keep a good thing growing!



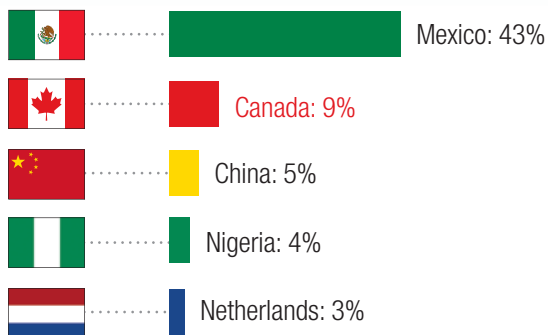
Texas exported \$602 million to Canada, including:

- \$183M in fresh/frozen beef
- \$72M in ethanol
- \$42M in coffee and tea extracts (including \$36M in coffee extracts)
- \$33M in fruits and nuts (including \$18M in pecans)
- \$31M in gums/resins derived from seeds

Texas imported \$695 million from Canada, including:

- \$117M in fats and oils (including \$105M in canola oil)
- \$91M in frozen fries
- \$62M in breads and pastries (including \$9M in waffles and wafers)
- \$52M in canola meal
- \$42M in alcoholic beverages (including \$21M in whiskey)

Texas' top agriculture and agri-food export markets:



A Strong Partnership in Trade:

Canada purchased \$21 billion in U.S. agriculture and agri-food products in 2012. Texas benefitted from this strong relationship in 2012 by exporting \$602 million in agriculture and agri-food products to Canada. To help reduce barriers to trade, lower costs and create economic opportunities, the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border Action Plans were released in December 2011. Increased regulatory cooperation will support U.S.-Canada trade in agriculture and agri-food products, contribute to job creation, and provide a greater variety of safe, high-quality food products for consumers.

Trade with Canada = Jobs in Texas

→ Approximately 625,000 jobs in Texas depend on trade with Canada.

All currency is in U.S. dollars and based on 2012 data (as of July 2013).
All export figures do not include re-export values.
Trade values are approximate and have been rounded where/when appropriate.
Fertilizers, farm machinery and seafood are not included in the definition of agriculture and agri-food trade.
Commodity categories are based on the internationally standardized Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS codes).
Wherein a single commodity is 90 percent or more of an HS group, the specific commodity is named.
