AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$1.8 BILLION IN 2014
Let's keep a good thing growing!



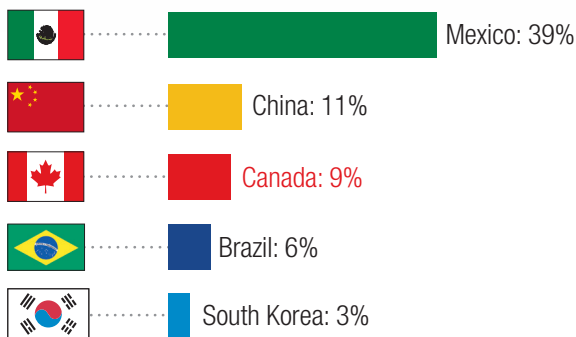
Texas exported \$962 million to Canada, including:

- \$226M in fruits and nuts (including \$56M in raspberries and blackberries)
- \$168M in ethanol
- \$103M in vegetables (including \$34M in tomatoes)
- \$96M in fresh/frozen beef
- \$40M in sauces and condiments

Texas imported \$856 million from Canada, including:

- \$143M in fresh/frozen meat (including \$83M in beef)
- \$139M in fats and oils (including \$128M in canola oil)
- \$98M in processed potatoes (including fries and chips)
- \$79M in baked goods
- \$73M in animal feed (including \$64M in canola meal)

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

Keep trade moooving! Beef cattle production represents one of the largest single segments of agriculture in Texas. Canadians showed that they enjoy Texas beef products by importing \$96M of fresh and frozen beef products in 2014, making Canada one of Texas' top export markets for beef. Meanwhile, Texans had the opportunity to taste Canadian beef by importing \$83M of fresh and frozen beef products. This trading relationship allows consumers in both Texas and Canada to taste beef of exceptional flavor, tenderness and juiciness. Canadians enjoy importing over \$226M of fruit and nuts from Texas, because of its warmer climate. Meanwhile, Texans imported \$128M in canola oil from Canada. The U.S.-Canada trading relationship is increasingly important as trade and integration mutually strengthen our competitive position within the changing global marketplace.
