
Virginia exported \$252 million to Canada, including:

- → \$46M in infant food
- → \$27M in food preparations
- → \$26M in chocolate products
- → \$26M in roasted coffee
- → \$19M in non-alcoholic beverages (including \$14M in flavored water)

Virginia imported \$225 million from Canada, including:

- → \$42M in fresh/frozen pork
- → \$28M in frozen fries
- → \$25M in wheat (including \$20M in durum wheat)
- → \$23M in vegetables and legumes (including \$3M in peas)
- → \$20M in breads and pastries (including \$2M in cookies)

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, agriculture and agri-food trade has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S., and in particular Virginia, has benefited from this strong relationship with Canada purchasing over \$21 billion in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2013, of which \$252 million came from Virginia.
- The work of the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border initiatives is significant to our continued growth in agriculture and agri-food trade and to strengthening our industry competitiveness. For more information: www.actionplan.gc.ca/rcc
