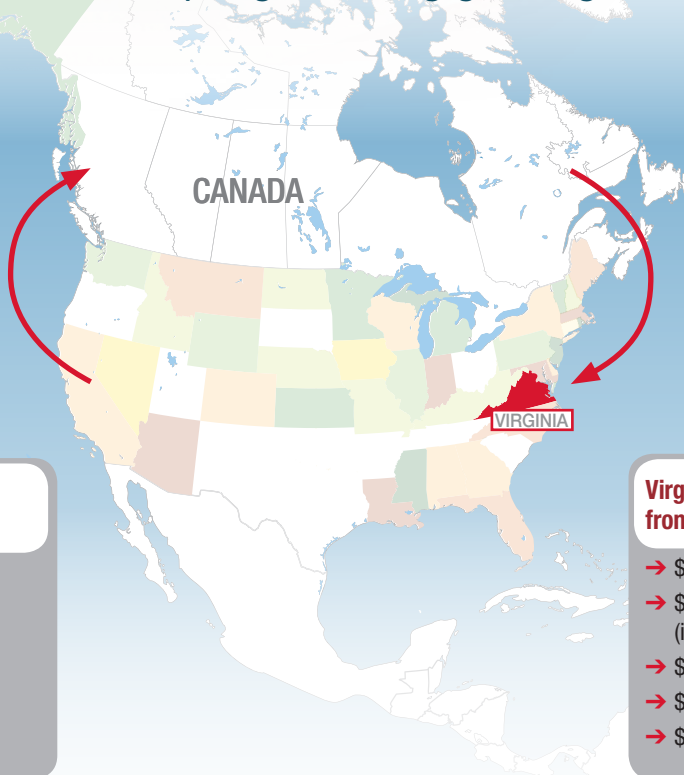


VIRGINIA-CANADA

AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$447 MILLION IN 2014

Let's keep a good thing growing!



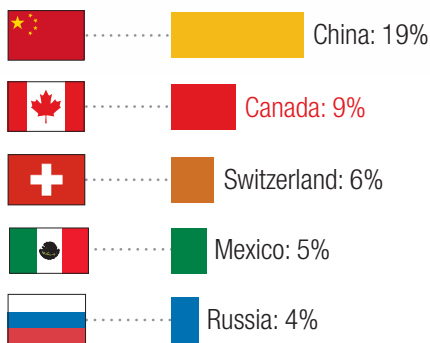
Virginia exported \$233 million to Canada, including:

- \$29M in food preparations*
- \$28M in coffee
- \$25M in sauces and condiments
- \$24M in non-alcoholic beverages (including \$15M in flavored water)
- \$21M in chocolate products

Virginia imported \$214 million from Canada, including:

- \$54M in fresh/frozen pork
- \$27M in processed potatoes (including fries and chips)
- \$24M in baked goods
- \$16M in vegetables
- \$15M in wheat

A Strong Partnership in Trade:

- Since 2005, agriculture and agri-food trade between the U.S. and Canada has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a more integrated North American marketplace.
- The U.S. and, in particular, Virginia has benefited from this strong relationship - with Canada purchasing over \$26B in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2014, of which \$233M came from Virginia.
- Supply chains that cross our shared border are cost-effective and efficient because of the proximity to each other's agricultural inputs and products. For example, Canada is a major supplier of energy and fertilizers, while the U.S. equips Canada with farm machinery and crop protection technologies.
- Access to Canadian cattle, hogs, and oilseeds allows American feedlots, finishers, and crushing plants to run at capacity, supporting U.S. jobs.
