BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Washington is the number one exporter of fresh apples in the United States. Canada is its top export market, importing $\$ 123$ million worth in 2010. Canada exports approximately a third of its cattle to Washington, making the state the largest export market for Canadian cattle. The Washington-Canada trading relationship enables product specialization, ensuring both are supplied with high quality agricultural products.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN WASHINGTON
$\rightarrow$ Approximately 174,000 jobs (or 1 in 18 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
