
WASHINGTON EXPORTED \$832 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$123M in fresh apples
- → \$91M in roasted coffee
- → \$54M in frozen fries
- → \$43M in onions and shallots
- → \$32M in potatoes

WASHINGTON IMPORTED \$1.1 BILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$389M in cattle
- → \$53M in canola oil
- → \$41M in animal feed
- → \$40M in breads and pastries
- → \$36M in tomatoes

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Washington is the number one exporter of fresh apples in the United States. Canada is its top export market, importing \$123 million worth in 2010. Canada exports approximately a third of its cattle to Washington, making the state the largest export market for Canadian cattle. The Washington-Canada trading relationship enables product specialization, ensuring both are supplied with high quality agricultural products.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN WASHINGTON

→ Approximately 174,000 jobs (or 1 in 18 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
