
### AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$276 MILLION IN 2012 Let's keep a good thing growing!

- → \$71M in rice
- → \$34M in prepared meats (including \$21M in prepared chicken meat)
- → \$25M in fresh/frozen chicken meat
- → \$23M in prepared cereals (including \$15M in breakfast cereals)
- \$13M in eggs

#### A Strong Partnership in Trade:

Canada purchased \$21 billion in U.S. agriculture and agri-food products in 2012. Arkansas benefitted from this strong relationship in 2012 by exporting \$208 million in agriculture and agri-food products to Canada. To help reduce barriers to trade, lower costs and create economic opportunities, the Regulatory Cooperation Council and Beyond the Border Action Plans were released in December 2011. Increased regulatory cooperation will support U.S.-Canada trade in agriculture and agri-food products, contribute to job creation, and provide a greater variety of safe, high-quality food products for consumers.

Arkansas imported \$68 million from

→ \$15M in alcoholic beverages (including \$7M in liqueurs and cordials)

Canada, including:

→ \$12M in canola oil \$10M in frozen fries

→ \$7M in breads and pastries

→ \$3M in sauces and condiments
