
WEST VIRGINIA EXPORTED \$6 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$2M in meats for animal feed
- → \$0.9M in poultry
- → \$0.8M in sauces and condiments
- → \$0.3M in beef
- → \$0.2M in eggs

WEST VIRGINIA IMPORTED \$4 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- → \$2M in eggs
- → \$0.5M in breads and pastries
- → \$0.2M in horses, donkeys and mules
- → \$0.2M in beer
- → \$0.2 million in cut flowers

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION, INTEGRATION AND EFFICIENCIES

West Virginia's second largest agricultural export is animal feed (hay and straw). West Virginia exported animal feed to Canada, which helped feed the horses, donkeys and mules that were then exported to West Virginia. The integration of West Virginia-Canada supply chains enables product specialization, ensuring a successful trading relationship where both are supplied with high quality agricultural products.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN WEST VIRGINIA

→ Approximately 40,900 jobs (or 1 in 19 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
