Wyoming exported \$8 million to Canada, including:

- → \$3M in seeds (including \$2M in sugar beet seeds)
- → \$2M in gums/resins
- → \$1M in dried beans and peas (including \$734K in kidney and pea beans)
- → \$581K in oat grains
- → \$563K in sauces and condiments

Wyoming imported \$18 million from Canada, including:

- → \$11M in live cattle
- → \$3M in baked goods (including \$228K in gingerbread)
- → \$1M in alfalfa seeds
- → \$943K in insects
- → \$807K in buffalo

Since 2005, agriculture and agri-food trade between the U.S. and Canada has more than quadrupled, leading to significant changes in trade patterns and resulting in a


