

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION AND EFFICIENCIES

California is the leading U.S. state in the export of grapes, almonds and walnuts. Canada imported \$199 million in grapes, \$96 million in almonds and \$43 million in walnuts from California in 2010. Meanwhile, California imported \$222 million in beef and \$89 million in pork from Canada in 2010. The bilateral trading relationship between California and Canada ensures that both can further develop their areas of specialization and can supply each other with high quality, healthy and delicious food products.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN CALIFORNIA

→ Approximately 932,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
