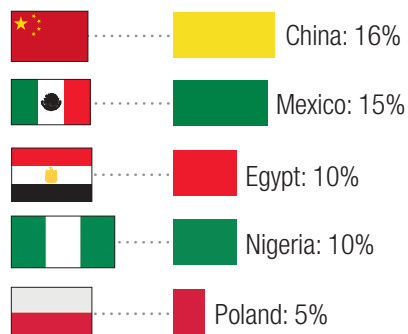
CONNECTICUT EXPORTED \$34 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$11M in food preparations
- \$4M in animal feed
- \$3M in non-alcohol beverages
- \$3M in tea
- \$2M in sugar confectionery

CONNECTICUT IMPORTED \$125 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$14M in vegetables
- \$13M in whiskey
- \$13M in breads and pastries
- \$10M in ethanol
- \$7M in frozen fries

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION AND EFFICIENCIES

Connecticut and Canada traded over \$38 million in beverages last year, making it a key component of our growing trading relationship. Connecticut bought \$13 million in whiskey, \$4 million in liqueurs and cordials, and \$4 million in beer. Meanwhile, Connecticut sent Canada \$3 million in tea, over \$1 million in orange juice, and \$1 million in assorted fruit juices. By playing to our strengths in our bilateral trading relationship, Connecticut and Canada are able to meet their consumers' demand for a variety of beverage options.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN CONNECTICUT

- Approximately 100,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
