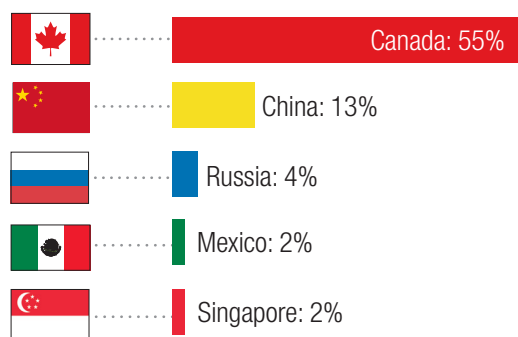
DELAWARE EXPORTED \$31 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$7M in chicken
- \$5M in food preparations
(including jelly powder)
- \$5M in breads and pastries
- \$5M in sauces and condiments
- \$1M in watermelons

DELAWARE IMPORTED \$14 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$5M in breads and pastries
- \$2M in tomatoes
- \$1M in peppers
- \$1M in malt
- \$0.6M in cucumbers and gherkins

BILATERAL TRADE SUPPORTS INCREASED SECTOR SPECIALIZATION AND EFFICIENCY

Delaware's agricultural exports to Canada have nearly doubled since 2005, expanding from \$16 million to \$31 million in 2010. Our bilateral trading relationship is providing Delaware with a steady demand for its goods and supporting the growth of several industries. For example, the state's exports of jelly powders to Canada have risen dramatically since 2005, climbing from \$0 to over \$3 million in 2010. Our strong trading relationship is a key contributor to the growth of Delaware's processing industries in particular, as well as its agriculture sector at large.

TRADE WITH CANADA = JOBS IN DELAWARE

- Approximately 25,000 jobs (or 1 in 17 people employed) depend on overall trade with Canada.
