

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A BRIEF PROFILE OF THE PUBLIC LENDING RIGHT PROGRAM

Purpose

The Public Lending Right Commission makes payments to Canadian authors for the availability of their books catalogued in Canadian libraries, according to the PLR program's eligibility criteria.

Background

The PLR program was created in 1986 after nearly forty years of lobbying on the part of Canada's national writers' organizations. Canada is one of eighteen countries to have implemented such a program. The Canadian PLR program receives annual funding from Parliament (\$9.449 million in 2004-2005) and operates under the aegis of the Canada Council for the Arts. The Public Lending Right Commission is made up of a predominantly writer-composed board, which represents national organizations of writers, librarians and publishers, and which is responsible for setting the general policies of the program. An executive committee are chaired by writer Carole David.

Program

Authors register their titles with the Commission. The Commission in turn compiles a master list of titles which is checked annually against the holdings of a representative number of libraries (six for each official language group). An author is paid an amount per book each time the title is found in one of the sampled libraries. The PLR payment ceiling in 2004-2005 was \$3,017.

CHAIR'S REPORT Carole David

In February 2005, the Public Lending Right Commission (PLRC) distributed its 19th round of payments. The Commission sent cheques to 14,441 Canadian authors for a total of \$8,962,741 – remuneration to authors, illustrators and translators for the presence of 54,776 eligible titles in public libraries throughout the country.

The Public Lending Right program is going through a period of adjustment. In all its deliberations and decisions, the Commission has continued to defend and protect this fundamental program by focussing on the sampling procedures, a sliding scale plan and efforts to secure additional funding from the government.

Changes to sampling of libraries

This year, the Commission sampled the catalogues of public libraries rather than a combination of public and university libraries. This has enabled the Commission to return to its initial philosophy, namely to pay authors for the general public's access to their books. Municipal mergers and the increasing development of collective catalogues at the provincial level now give the Commission access to a larger network of public library holdings.

Sampling public libraries had various results. While some payments were similar to those of previous years, others increased or decreased. Each case is different. It should be noted that a PLR cheque is not an annuity, but an annual payment that may fluctuate.

For the first time, the sampling included an equal number of French- and English-language libraries. Six library networks in each language group were sampled, and the results from the two largest urban centres were doubled. The results therefore figured out of seven in each language group. (In the past, English titles were sampled in ten English-language libraries and French titles in five French-language libraries; the results for the French-language libraries were then doubled.)

Sliding scale plan

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Since the inception of the PLR program, the number of eligible authors and titles has grown considerably. Unfortunately, the budget has not increased sufficiently to allow payments to remain stable. As outlined in past reports, the Commission has developed a plan to manage growth in the program.

The basic principle behind the sliding scale plan is as follows: a registered title would receive a higher "hit rate", relative to the current rate, for its first five years in the program. This period of time corresponds to the period when titles are most often borrowed from libraries. Thereafter, the rate would decrease over time. The following five years would see the title receive 80% of the initial amount, and the next five years 70%. Titles that have been in the program more than 15 years would receive payments based on remaining funds in the budget.

Some associations representing authors from different parts of the country have expressed concern about the application of these measures. Although everyone agreed that a solution was needed to deal with growth, members requested that the Commission examine other possible solutions before implementing the sliding scale plan.

At its December 2004 meeting, the Commission decided to implement the variable rate plan only if the PLRC receives a significant increase in government funding.

Budget situation

In the fall of 2004, the PLR program had its budget cut by \$100,000. This was the result of the initial phase of the government's program review aimed at recovering \$1 billion from existing programs for redistribution to priority programs. The budget for payments, however, recovered \$73,000 from the Canada Council's investment fund.

Also, the Tomorrow Starts Today program was renewed for another year. The PLRC receives \$1 million per year under this program. We are of the opinion that this fund must become an integral part of the basic budget for the Canada Council for the Arts and, as a result, the PLRC's budget.

Once the government re-allocation process has been completed, the PLRC will submit a major request for additional funding in order to implement the sliding scale plan which, we believe, will ensure greater stability for the PLR program.

Administrative arrangement between the Public Lending Right Commission and the Canada Council for the Arts

The Commission signed an administrative arrangement with the Canada Council for the Arts in February 2005. The agreement clarifies the relationship with the Council and ensures that new funds will be allocated by the Department of Canadian Heritage specifically for the PLR program. We would like to acknowledge the close cooperation of Mark Watters, Secretary-Treasurer of the Canada Council, who worked through nine drafts of the document to facilitate the signing of this agreement, which went into effect April 1, 2005.

Changes to PLRC statutes and by-laws

The sub-committee established in December 2003 to examine the terms of office and develop a more formal definition of the obligations of Commission members has submitted its recommendations. The recommendations were accepted by the Commission at a special general meeting in December 2004. The modifications, which clarify the duties of members, are intended to make the members more accountable with respect to their associations and within the Commission. Finally, in order to ensure fair representation and rotation in the membership, the Commission has determined that members may serve a four-year term that

can be renewed once. Likewise, the outgoing Chair of the Commission must wait two years before seeking a new mandate as a member of the Commission.

Departure of Gwen Hoover

Last April, Gwen Hoover, who had been employed by the Canada Council for the Arts since 1973 and had served as the Executive Secretary of the Commission since July 1990, retired. With unparalleled efforts and dedication, she contributed to the survival and prosperity of the program. Canadian authors owe her an enormous debt. I thank her on their behalf.

Appointment of new Executive Secretary

David Schimpky is the new Executive Secretary of the Public Lending Right Commission. This appointment took effect June 8, 2005. Benoît Rollin, a long-time employee of the PLRC, agreed to serve as the Executive Secretary until Mr. Schimpky took up his duties.

Conclusion

More dedicated than ever to its mission of ensuring that Canadian works are accessible to the general public, the Commission hopes to ensure greater stability for the PLR program. The energy of Canadian publishing is not waning. This year, 811 new authors registered in the program, 685 of whom received a payment. Nevertheless, in order to compensate authors adequately in the coming years, it is clear that the government must provide additional funding.


Average: In February 2005, the average payment was \$621.

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




