Participants took in the first of four moderated panel discussions. These dynamic sessions covered a range of topics, including *Business Models that Work, Moving Technologies from the Test Bench to the Marketplace,* and *Leveraging Defence Procurement.*

Participants also had the opportunity to attend keynote addresses by the Honourable James Moore, Minister of Industry and the Honourable Diane Finley, Minister of Public Works and Government Services. Minister Moore's address

focused on <u>Digital Canada 150</u>, a plan for Canadian businesses and communities to take full advantage of the opportunities presented in the digital age. Minister Finley spoke on the Harper Government's objective to create jobs and growth in Canada through initiatives under the <u>Defence Procurement</u> <u>Strategy</u>.

WD is pleased to have facilitated more than 140 individual Business-to-Business (B2B) and Business-to-

Government (B2G) meetings, and several networking breaks, over the two day Forum. These meetings were crucial to enabling participants to gain extremely valuable time with equipment manufacturers and the more than 12 notable international defence and security contractors in attendance. programs that support innovation and technology commercialization.

Most importantly, more than 80 per cent of participants agreed that they were able to establish new connections, and nearly half of the attendees were able to identify prospective business leads.

The Western Innovation Forum's Innovation Stage

Over the two-day Forum, participants also had access to the Forum's Innovation Stage. Hosted by Mitacs, the stage allowed 14 start-up businesses and innovators to showcase their innovations and products to a range of potential investors and partners. The innovative products demonstrated on the stage ranged from Marine Technologies to Unmanned Vehicle Systems, drawing a considerable amount of interest from the audience. Following the demonstrations, audience members had the opportunity to speak with presenters about their new innovations through informative Question and Answer sessions, and networking breaks.
