Connecting Western Canadian Aerospace Companies with Global Opportunities

The aerospace industry is in full swing in Western Canada with continued growth, at home and around the world. Employing over 27,000 people in high skilled jobs and generating over \$3 billion in annual revenues in the West, Canada is truly a leader in aerospace.

Last month, Minister Rempel participated in the Farnborough International Airshow in Farnborough, England, one of the world's largest exhibitions and air displays, where she officially opened the Western Canada reception.

"The Farnborough Airshow was a great opportunity for targeted networking with professionals and to promote Western Canada's aerospace sector on an international level. The aerospace industry in the West has a strong reputation for innovation through research and development, as well as a highly-skilled workforce," said Minister Rempel.

In partnership with the Aerospace Industries Association of Canada (AIAC), the Harper Government, through WD, is supporting seven interrelated projects that promote the western Canadian aerospace industry. Ultimately, this will enhance market access and supply chain development opportunities for small- and medium-sized enterprises across the West. At the Farnborough Airshow, WD's support meant an

opportunity for the West's businesses to connect with international contractors, including some of the industry's most important players.

This year, Western Canada had a strong presence at Farnborough, with a total of 23 western companies and organizations attending. The results were success stories and deals, which contribute to the advancement of global aerospace capabilities and new economic opportunities for Canadians.

while promoting trade and investment in the defence and security industries.


