Introduction

In October 2005, the Government approved a five-year continuation of the Security and Defence Forum (SDF) with a 25% increase in funding that will see it through its fortieth anniversary in the fall of 2007. The conclusion of FY 2006-07 marked the end of the first year in a new funding cycle that will run until 2011.

This report covers the first of a new five-year funding cycle. This is the second cycle to use a results-based management and accountability framework.

Over the last year, the SDF continued its established tradition of promoting the development of Canadian competence in security and defence issues through grants to universities, scholarships to students and diverse special projects.

March 31, 2007 brought to a close another successful year for the Security and Defence Forum:

- distribution of the SDF Newsletter increased;
- SDF Award winners and Centre graduate students were brought together for the first time to attend a two-day briefing session in Ottawa; and,
- there was stronger emphasis on relevant security and defence issues.

Several additions to the SDF program were also introduced:

- the SDF Discussion Board;
- the formalization of the International Conference Fund and the introduction of the National Conference Fund;
- increases in the number and value of many SDF awards; and,
- Special Projects funding allotted for an annual graduate student briefing session.

Governance

Premised on academic liberty and overseen by an independent Selection Committee appointed by the Minister of National Defence, the Security and Defence Forum is mandated to:

- build and support a strong Canadian knowledge base in contemporary security and defence issues;
- foster informed public policy discussion and commentary through research, teaching, outreach and public education initiatives; and,
- enhance communication and interaction between the Department of National Defence, the Canadian Forces and the Canadian academic community.

The Selection Committee meets annually to review the budgets and annual reports of the Centres of Expertise and the Chair of Defence Management Studies in order to assess performance and ensure value for money.

The Selection Committee also recommends the recipients of annual academic awards, including fellowships, scholarships and internships. The Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada administers these awards on behalf of the Department of National Defence.

There were several changes to the Selection Committee members in 2006-07. Dr. James A. Bayer concluded his term as Committee Chair and four new members were added.

In 2006-07 members from the academic community were:

- Dr. Kim Nossal (Chair), Head of the Department of Political Studies, Queen's University (returning);
- Dr. Frank Harvey, Dalhousie University (new);
- Dr. Nelson Michaud, École nationale d'administration publique (new); and;
- Dr. Elinor Sloan, Carleton University (new).

Members from the community at large were:

- Mr. Arthur C. Perron, retired Vice-President Communications at CAE and former Canadian Ambassador to South Korea, Hong Kong and South Africa (returning);
- Major-General (retired) Cameron Ross, Senior Military Advisor, EnCana; and;
- Ms. Kathryn White, Executive Director United Nations Association in Canada (returning).

New SDF Selection Committee Chair

In January 2007, Kim Richard Nossal was appointed as the new Chair of the SDF Selection Committee. He served on the Committee as a member from the academic community since 2001.

Dr. Nossal was born in London, England, and was schooled in Melbourne, Beijing and Hong Kong. He completed his PhD at the University of Toronto. He began his career teaching international relations and Canadian foreign policy in the Department of Political Science at McMaster University in 1976 and served as Chair of the Department in 1989-1990 and 1992-1996. In 2001, he was appointed as head of the Department of Political Studies at Queen's University, where he continues to teach and conduct research.

His latest book, *Politique internationale et défense au Canada et au Québec*, co-authored with Stéphane Roussel and Stéphane Paquin, will be published by Les Presses de l'Université de Montréal and is expected to be released by the end of 2007.

Centres of Expertise and the Chair of Defence Management Studies

Security and Defence Forum operational grants were awarded to twelve Centres of Expertise and a Chair of Defence Management Studies at varying levels between \$100,000 to \$165,000. Appendix A provides details on the 2006-07 grants.

Centres have diverse research and teaching interests, and most take a multi-disciplinary approach to security and defence issues.

The beginning of the new funding cycle saw the amount of funding available for allocation to the Centres and the Chair increase to \$1,650,000. This represents an increase of 32%.

The SDF Business Committee

SDF Centre Directors and associates, and the Chair of Defence Management Studies gathered for their annual meeting on 30 April and 1 May 2007.

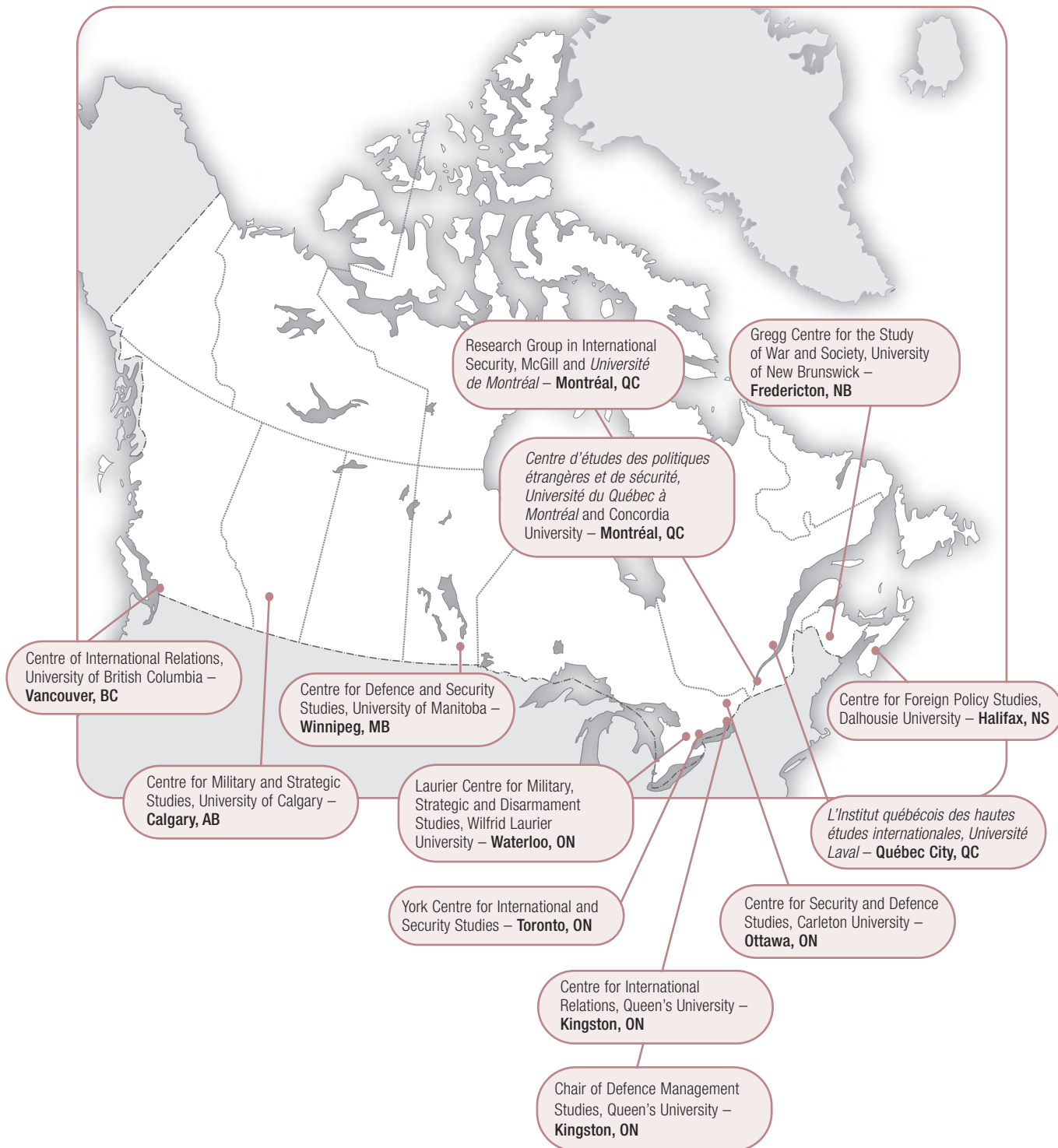
The Meeting began with an overview of the 2006-07 fiscal year and presentations on the Special Projects Fund, as well as the International and National Conference Funds.

SDF Courses, Students, Research and Publications

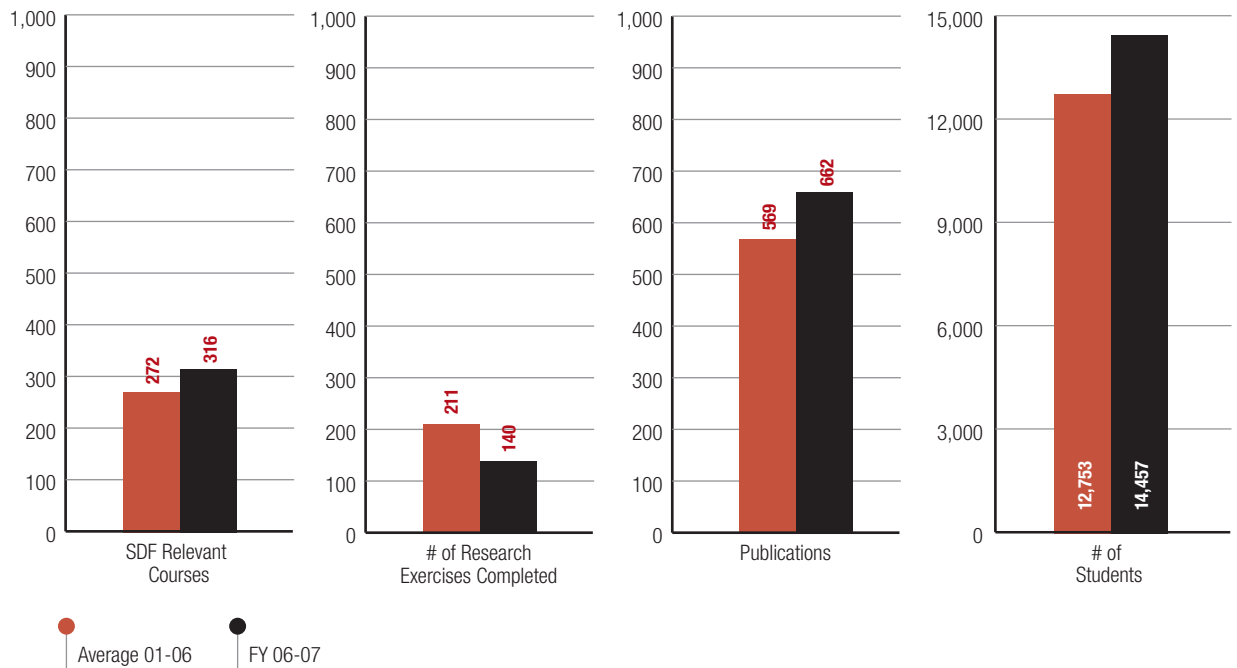

Reinventing Canadian Defence Procurement

In January 2007, the Chair of Defence Management Studies in the School of Policy Studies at Queen's University released *Reinventing Canadian Defence Procurement: A View from the Inside* by Mr. Alan Williams. The book discusses the results of a major research project, chaired by Mr. Williams, on reforming defence procurement in Canada.

Mr. Williams is a former Assistant Deputy Minister (Material) at NDHQ and is now a visiting Fellow in the Defence Management Studies Program.

New Faces in the SDF Community

The 2006-07 fiscal year saw several changes to the executive staff in the Centres. In September 2006, Dr. Brian Job returned from sabbatical to his post as Director of the University of British Columbia's Centre of International Relations.

Dr. T.V. Paul, professor at McGill University, assumed the role of Director of the Research Group in International Security at the Université de Montréal and McGill University.

Dr. Robert Latham joined the York Centre for International and Security Studies at York University as its new Director in January 2007.

At the beginning of the new academic year, the Gregg Centre for the Study of War and Society at the University of New Brunswick named Dr. Lee Windsor as its new Deputy Director.

Dr. Julian Schofield, professor at Concordia University, was named Deputy Director of Centre d'études des politiques étrangères et de sécurité.

Brigadier Milton F. Gregg VC, Centre for the Study of War and Society

The new Centre at the University of New Brunswick was officially named the Brigadier Milton F. Gregg, VC, Centre for the Study of War and Society on 12 September 2006. Brigadier Gregg was a well-known New Brunswick-born soldier, educator and politician/diplomat. He won the Victoria Cross in September 1918 while with the Royal Canadian Regiment at Marcoing Line. After the Great War, he went on to serve as President of the University of New Brunswick, Minister of Veterans' Affairs, Canada's representative at the UN, and the Honourary Colonel of The Royal Canadian Regiment

The Centre was formed by the amalgamation of the former Centre for Conflict Studies and the Military and Strategic Studies Programme at the University of New Brunswick. Its new mandate is three-fold: the study of war and society; the history of the Canadian Army; and, fostering public awareness of New Brunswick's military heritage. Its many activities include the publication of The "Journal of Conflict Studies," the book series of the New Brunswick Military Heritage Project, a very active teaching program, a lecture and conference series, and battlefield tours.

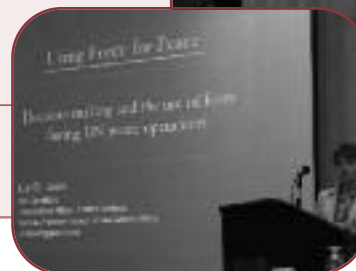
SDF Annual Conference

Academic Awards

For security and defence to survive as a viable field of academic study, young scholars must rise to the challenge of continuing to research in this field. To help facilitate this development, the Security and Defence Forum offers a number of awards aimed at supporting academic scholarship and advancing the careers of young scholars.

Awards available include Post-Doctoral fellowships, scholarships at the Doctoral and Master's level, and internships for post-graduates.

The number and value of many SDF awards increased in the new funding cycle. The number of PhD Scholarships and Internships increased and a new Aboriginal Scholarship Fund, valued at up to \$10,000, was introduced. The Ronald Baker Doctoral Scholarship, PhD Scholarships, Master's Scholarships and Internships increased in value.

In 2006-07, the Selection Committee awarded \$382,500 in academic awards:

- one R.B. Byers Post-Doctoral fellowship (\$35,000);
- one Post-Doctoral Fellowship (\$35,000);
- one Ronald Baker Doctoral Scholarship (\$22,500);
- four PhD Scholarships (\$20,000 each);
- six Master's Scholarships (\$10,000 each);
- one Aboriginal Scholarship (\$10,000); and;
- four internships (\$35,000 each) to young scholars who conducted research on a variety of topics relevant to security and defence studies.

Security and Defence Forum internships provide recent post-graduates with relevant work experience. Interns can work for a range of organizations in the security and defence field such as think tanks, non-governmental organizations, and international organizations.

Internship recipients conduct research on topics relevant to security and defence studies and while in their placements, they can gain experience in several areas. Some of these include: event planning, publishing, editing, research, media relations and administration.

In 2006-07, the SDF provided funding to four candidates. They were placed at the Canadian Institute for International Affairs, the Canadian Association of Defence and Security Industries, the Permanent Mission of Canada to the United Nations in New York, and the Conference of Defence Associations Institute.

SDF Award Winners and Graduate Students Briefing Session

The Directorate of Public Policy invited the 2006-07 SDF Award Winners and one graduate student from each Centre of Expertise and the Chair of Defence Management Studies to attend briefings at the Cartier Square Drill Hall in December 2006. Briefing topics included Canadian Forces command structure, the future security environment, defence strategic planning, the mission in Afghanistan, the Policy Officer Recruitment Programme, the Canada First Defence Strategy and Canada-U.S. relations.

The event gave the 23 participants a chance to not only discuss current defence issues with senior DND staff, but also to meet and discuss issues with other young scholars in the SDF community in both formal and informal settings.

Special Projects 2006-07

The Security and Defence Forum

Special Projects Fund provides modest grants to individuals or institutions to conduct research, academic activities, conferences, or other unique initiatives that are directly relevant to the mandate of the SDF.

The new funding cycle saw several aspects of the Special Projects Fund formalized. The National Conference Fund (NCF) was created to compliment the International Conference Fund (ICF), funds were reserved to support an annual SDF graduate student briefing session, and the SDF Discussion Board was launched.

In 2006-07, 53 of 60 projects were funded totaling \$307,570. This marked the highest number of applications received in a single year for the Special Projects Fund.

While 42% of Special Projects funding went to SDF Centres or affiliated researchers, a diverse number of projects from non-SDF universities and research centres, the voluntary sector and NGOs were also funded.

To increase awareness of the Special Projects Fund, events are featured in the bi-monthly Security and Defence Forum Newsletter and the Directorate of Public Policy assigns Policy Officers to attend and report on the policy implications of SDF funded events.

SDF Discussion Board

Consultations leading to the renewal of the SDF for the 2006-2011 funding cycle suggested the need for a new SDF initiative to facilitate effective exchange of information within the academic community – a need that was echoed at the Annual SDF Conference in Kingston.

In November 2006, the Directorate of Public Policy announced the selection of the Laurier Centre for Military Strategic and Disarmament Studies at Wilfrid Laurier University to develop and host the new SDF Internet discussion board.

The discussion board – which is open to scholars and the public alike – was launched in February 2007 and will serve as a useful forum to exchange views, share opinions and announce upcoming events of relevance to security and defence.

12th Annual Battlefield Tour

From 17-31 May 2006, 9 students from the Laurier Centre for Military Strategic and Disarmament Studies (LCMSDS) at Wilfrid Laurier University and 9 students from the Research Group in International Security (REGIS) participated in an annual Battlefield Study Tour.

The program included visits to Vimy Ridge, Beaumont-Hamel and Dieppe, as well as an intensive study of the Canadian role in the Battle of Normandy.

Each participant was required to research and present a biographical sketch of a Canadian soldier buried or commemorated at a memorial or military cemetery, as well as prepare one or more topics for discussion.

A primary purpose of the Tours is to instill humility and expose the students to tough questions about the meaning of events and the ways in which the memories of those events have been constructed.

Model NATO Conference at Carleton University

The sixth annual Model NATO conference, sponsored by the Centre for Security and Defence Studies, was held at Carleton University from 8-11 March 2007. Over 150 university students and faculty advisors from 13 universities participated in this year's event. The 2007 Model NATO hosted 27 delegations, representing 23 NATO members and 4 Partnership for Peace countries.

Speakers at the event included diplomats, academics and defence officials from Canada and NATO.

As in previous years, a special highlight of the conference was briefings to student delegations offered by NATO embassies located in Ottawa. National Defence Headquarters hosted the delegation from Queen's University, who represented Canada at the Conference. A faculty team from the University of New Brunswick under Dr. Lee Windsor's supervision coordinated crisis simulations.

The winning delegation from Royal Military College will visit NATO Headquarters in Brussels.



UNAC 50th Anniversary of Peacekeeping Roundtable Series

In order to commemorate the 'birth of peacekeeping' during the Suez and Sinai crisis in 1956, the United Nations Association-Canada (UNAC) organized a set of eight roundtable sessions that took place in locations across Canada from August 2006 to March 2007. The organizers hoped to serve as a bridging organization between government departments engaged in discussion around peacekeeping and peace building, and the broader community, including civil society. Topics included: training needs; Haiti; media influence; child soldiers; security and development; gender and *The Responsibility to Protect*.

The discussions, recommendations and feedback from all the roundtable sessions will be combined into a single volume that will be available both online and in book form in 2007.


International Conference Fund

Established in 2003 to facilitate the attendance and participation of senior students and junior faculty members at major international conferences, the International Conference Fund was formalized for the 2006-2011 funding cycle, with each Centre receiving a maximum allocation of \$11,000.

Although FY 2006-07 saw a decline in disbursements compared to the previous year, there was a significant surge of more than 100% in the number of events funded by the ICF. In all, over 40 SDF faculty and students attended international conferences and the Fund was used 39 times, for a total disbursement of \$66,598.

Security and Defence Forum scholars brought a Canadian voice and perspective to events around the world including the United States, Italy, Finland, Belgium, Ukraine, Ghana and Singapore.

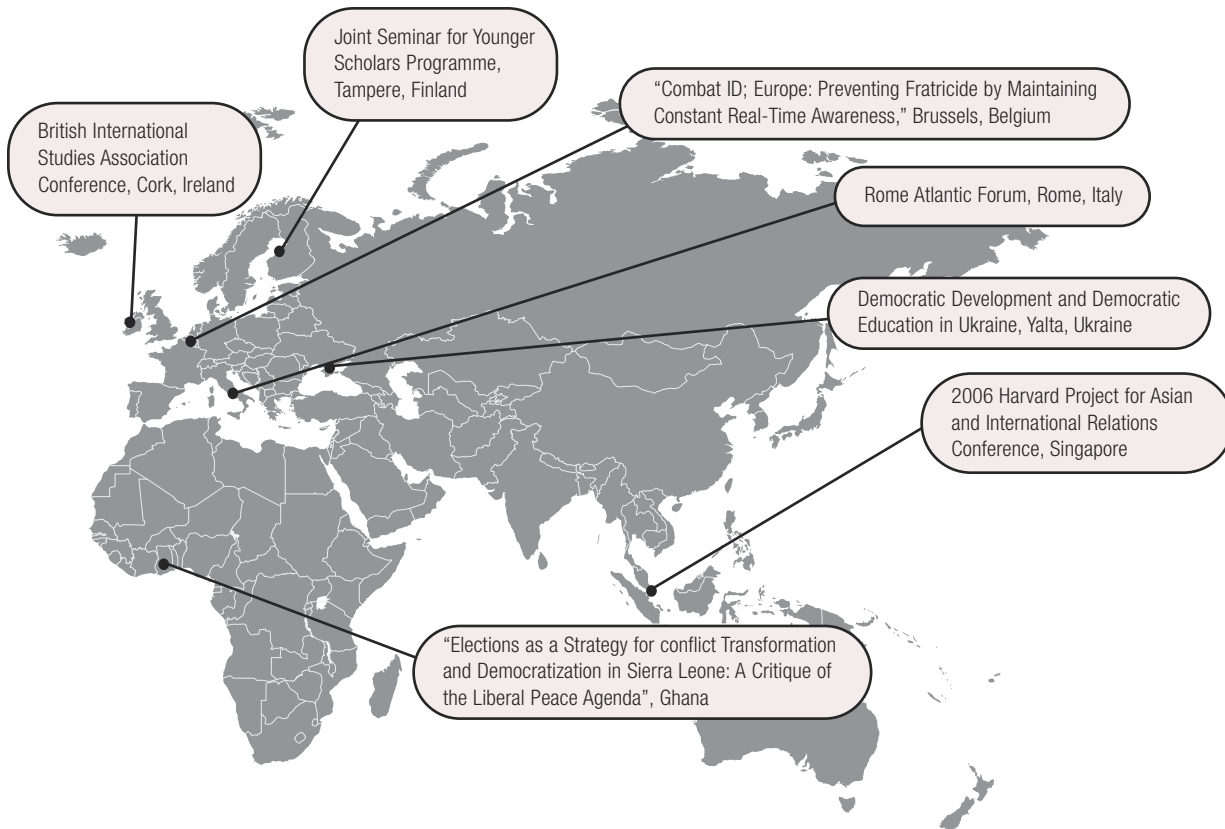
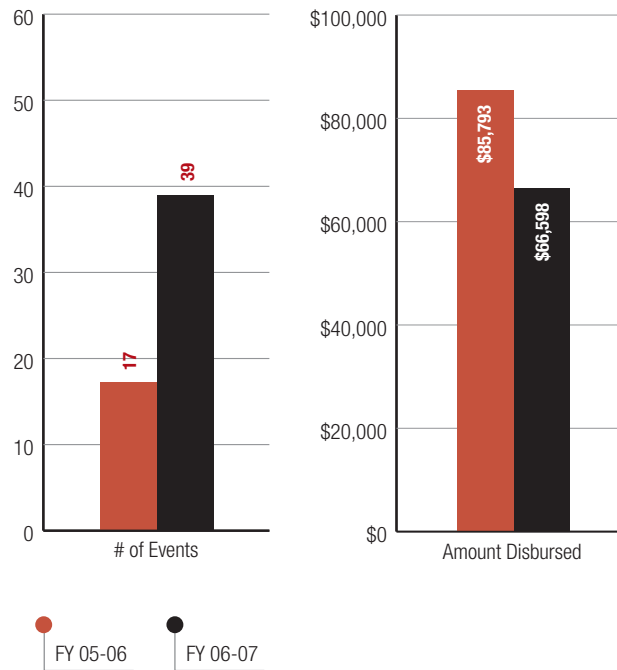

ICF Usage 2006-07



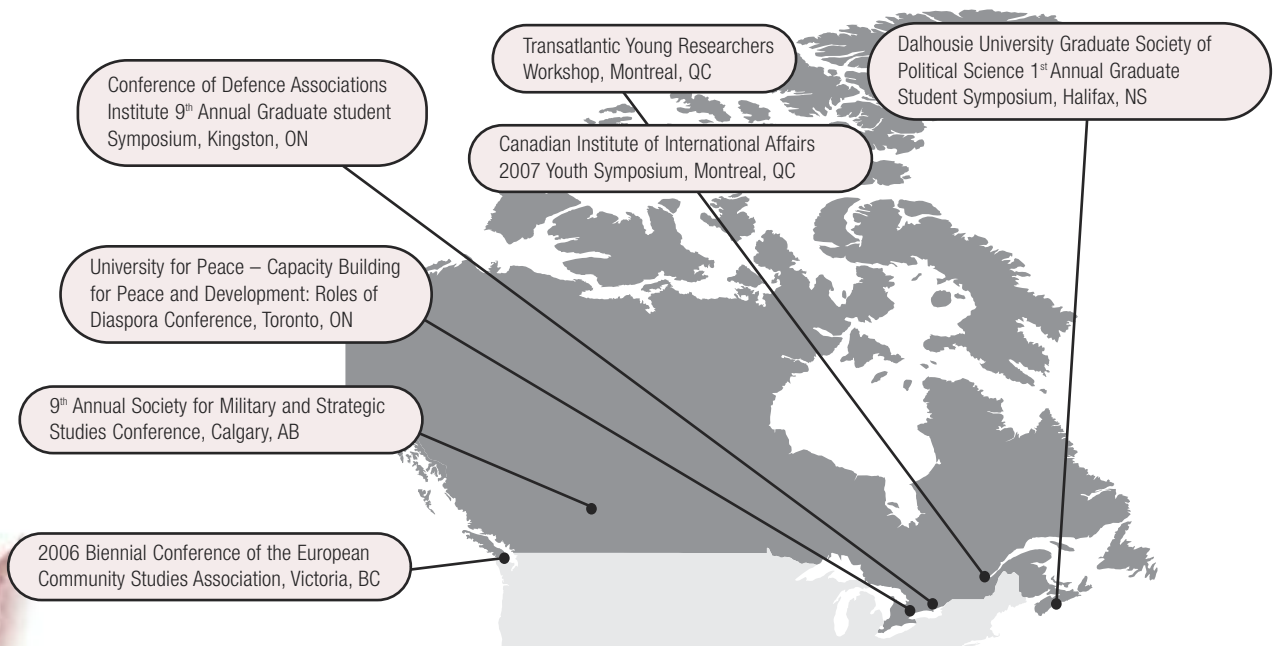
National Conference Fund

In addition to the formalization of the International Conference Fund, the new funding cycle saw the introduction of a National Conference Fund. Each Centre of Expertise was allocated \$5,000 to support travel for senior graduate students and junior faculty to participate in security and defence-related conferences within Canada.

In all, the NCF was used 25 times, for a total disbursement of \$20,473.

Participants funded by the NCF traveled across Canada to places such as Victoria, Calgary, Toronto, Kingston, Montreal and Halifax.

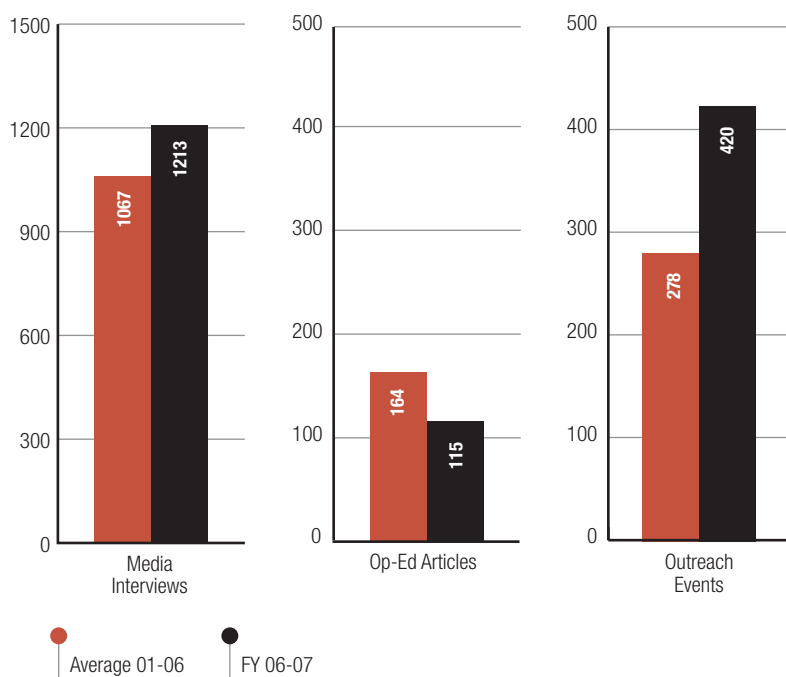
Public Awareness and Communication

The Security and Defence Forum is mandated to develop a domestic competence and national interest in defence issues of current and future relevance to Canadian security both within the academic community and through the Canadian public at large.

Though research, teaching and publications remain key aspects of the work of the academic community, as experts they are often asked to share their perspectives with the community and Canadians at large. In 2006-07, SDF Centres and the Chair reached out to the academic community, students and the general public through a variety of events, conferences and media engagements.

In all, Centres and the Chair organized or sponsored 420 events, reaching some 16,000 people. They also conducted more than 1,200 media interviews and produced 115 Op-ed articles on a wide range of topics.
