THE CANADA DAY CHALLENGE

Presented by the Department of Canadian Heritage, the Canada Day Challenge is a well-known arts, photography and creative writing competitions for youth in Canada! With roots dating back to 1987, hundreds of thousands of participants have taken up the Challenge and shown their pride in Canada.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE

Youth aged 8 to 18 years old, who live in Canada.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

This year, the theme is: **Strong. Proud. Free.**

Entries will be accepted from January 1 to April 2, 2015.

We are looking for entries that explore Canada's history, culture, and identity and illustrate the important milestones that have shaped our country on *The Road to 2017* when Canada will celebrate its 150th anniversary!

You are invited to draw a picture, take a photo, or write a short story, a poem or an essay — you decide which category works best for you. Can't decide? You can also submit an entry in each of the three categories.

Make sure to read through the contest <u>Official Rules</u> before submitting an entry, as there are specific requirements for each category.

DRAW IT!

Our home and creative land! From St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador, to Lunenburg, Nova Scotia, to Johnson Street in Victoria, British Colombia, vibrant colour abounds in Canada, so try your best to create an original, colourful drawing or painting using a variety of mediums.

The goal is to create an entry that illustrates what makes you proud to be Canadian. Avoid using clip art or photographs in your entry. Instead, use your imagination to create art that is completely original!

Did you know that when Canada became a country in 1867, it included only four provinces: New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Ontario and Quebec?

Take a picture of what you believe makes this country a truly special place — for example, capture Canadian symbols, like the National Flag of Canada, in your home town or city, or explore local museums, national historic sites, or even a public park to discover the people, places and events of our past and present!

You can submit up to five (5) photos. Your photo should be saved as a JPEG/JPG or PNG format. For all photos containing images of people, you will have to affirm that you have the <u>Canada Day Challenge 2015</u> <u>Personal Information Consent Form</u> signed and on file.

We're looking for clean focus and high resolution, so remember to set your camera to its highest resolution.

Did you know that February 15, 2015 will mark 50 years since the day in 1965 when our red and white maple leaf flag was first raised over Parliament Hill in Ottawa?
