The July 1 survey of employment and payrolls showed continued BRARY improvement in the situation. On 1949 as 100, the index of employment advanced by 2.9 p.c. in the month to 114.9, while the payroll figure rose by 3.1 p.c. to 163.6. The latter was a new all-time high. The employment index was 2.9 p.c. higher than at July 1, 1954, and was the same as at that date in 1953, a maximum for the time of year. The per capita weekly wages and salaries, at \$60.87, were higher than at June 1, 1955, also exceeding the July 1 average in earlier years of the record.

The upward movement of industrial activity extended to all provinces. There were also generally distributed increases in employment over June 1 in each of the industrial divisions surveyed, those in manufacturing and construction being most noteworthy.

Employment in manufacturing rose in the month by 1.9 p.c., bringing the July 1 index to 111.4. This was 2.4 p.c. above the figure recorded 12 months earlier, but was 2.9 p.c. lower than at July 1, 1953. Staffs in this group of industries were larger than at June 1 in all provinces except Prince Edward Island. Payroll disbursements in all areas also exceeded those reported in the preceding enquiry, the Canada index rising by 1.5 p.c. to 161.2, a new high, 6.3 p.c. above its July 1, 1954, position. Weekly wages and salaries in manufacturing plants at the date under review averaged \$63.28. This was rather lower than the June 1 figure of \$63.54, but exceeded the per capita earnings of \$60.99 indicated at July 1 a year ago.
