ADVANCE STATEMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND WEEKLY EARNINGS MAY, 1959

(These data are subject to revision)

The industrial composite index number of employment for May was 119.3 (1949=100), up seasonally by 3.1 p.c. from the April figure of 115.7. Increases were recorded for each industry division, and for every province. Seasonal influences were the main factors in most of these changes. Manufacturing employment was up a little more than seasonally, while the April to May increase in the highways, bridges and streets construction was somewhat smaller than usual.

The Canada composite figure of average weekly wages and salaries increased by 67 cents from April to May, reaching \$73.93 in the latter month. The composite payroll index for May 1959 was 206.1, up 4 p.c. from the index number for April 1959 and 5 p.c. from that for May 1958.
