ADVANCE STATEMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND WEEKLY EARNINGS,
JULY, 1959

Employment in most industries covered in the monthly survey showed normal seasonal movements from June to July. Industrial disputes in British Columbia led to substantial declines in wood products and forestry. The reductions in these two industries were the main factors in the decline in the seasonally-adjusted composite index, which fell by about 1 p.c. between the two months. The unadjusted composite was down slightly, dropping from 123.5 (1949=100) in June to 123.1 in July.

Average weekly wages and salaries, which dipped by 11 cents from May to June, regained most of the loss in July. The composite figure for the latter part of July was \$73.78. The composite payroll index for July 1959 was 212.3, up 5.3 p.c. from the figure for July 1958.
