ADVANCE STATEMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND WEEKLY EARNINGS,

APRIL, 1960

(These data are subject to revision)

During April, industrial employment rose slowly from the March seasonal low, with the composite index increasing to 114.8 (1949=100), a rise of 0.5 p.c. over the month. Unfavourable weather conditions and the late Easter slowed seasonal employment increases in some areas, and major layoffs in coal mining also tended to keep employment levels down. The March to April rise was the smallest recorded since 1952.

The composite figure of average weekly wages and salaries for April was \$75.98, up 61 cents from the March average.

Industrial payrolls rose by 1.3 p.c. over the month, with the composite index increasing from 201.5 in March to 204.1 in April.
