ADVANCE STATEMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND WEEKLY EARNINGS

SEPTEMBER, 1962

The industrial composite index of employment (1949=100) for September was down 0.5 p.c. from August to 126.4. Most industrial divisions showed lower levels of employment as firms reduced their staffs with the oncoming of fall. These declines were partly offset by seasonal increases in forestry and trade.

Seasonally adjusted, the composite declined by 0.2 p.c. to 121.6. The decline was reflected in the seasonally-adjusted indexes for most major industrial divisions. The exceptions were manufacturing, trade and finance, insurance and real estate which were virtually unchanged.

In manufacturing the movements of the seasonally-adjusted indexes of the major components were offsetting. The September index for durables, at 113.9, was up 1.1 p.c. from August. The advance reflected a larger-thanusual increase in transportation equipment as workers were recalled in the motor vehicles industry after the July and August layoffs. This rise was counteracted by a decline in non-durables as the food and beverage group showed decreases that were above average.

The industrial composite of average weekly wages and salaries rose to \$81.37 in September, up 57 cents from August. The increases reflected an advance of \$1.76 in durable goods manufacturing where increased staffs and a longer work-week raised per capita earnings.

The payrolls index for September rose slightly from 241.0 to 241.5. This figure was 5.9 p.c. above the same month last year.
