ADVANCE STATEMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND WEEKLY FARNINGS

JANUARY, 1963

(These data are subject to revision)

The industrial composite index of employment (1949=100) declined by 2.0 p.c. from December to 117.8 in January. The usual sharp reduction in trade, following the seasonal peak in December, accounted for two thirds of the decline. Despite the large decrease in trade, the overall decline was milder than in previous years largely because of an increase in manufacturing and a smaller-than-usual decrease in construction.

Seasonally-adjusted, the industrial composite rose over the month by 0.8 p.c. to 123.3. The increase reflected gains in construction and manufacturing. There were also advances in public utility operation, service and finance, insurance and real estate. Forestry was the only industry for which the adjusted index declined.

In manufacturing, there were increases in the adjusted indexes for both durable and non-durable goods manufacturing. In durables, employment gains in wood and iron and steel products outweighed a larger-than-seasonal decline in non-metallic mineral products. In non-durables, the resumption of operations in a few large tobacco-processing plants after temporary layoffs during the last half of December was a factor in the advance. However, there was also some strengthening in leather, textile and clothing products.

The industrial composite of average weekly wages and salaries for January at \$81.87 was \$3.42 above the December figure. A large increase at this time is usual mainly because December levels are depressed by short time during the Christmas season.

The payroll index rose by 2.3 p.c. over the month to 226.5 in January. The latest index was 5.6 p.c. above the same month last year.
