ADVANCE STATE TENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND WEEKLY EARNINGS

SEPTEMBER, 1963

(These data are subject to revision)

The industrial composite index of employment (1949=100) was 130.1 at the end of September 1963, virtually unchanged from the August figure of 130.2. Increases in forestry, manufacturing and trade were balanced by declines in the remaining industrial divisions.

Seasonally adjusted, the industrial composite rose from 124.5 to 125.2 from August to September. The increase reflected strengthening in durable goods manufacturing, construction, transportation, storage and communication, and trade. There was little change in the adjusted indexes for the remaining industrial divisions.

In manufacturing, the advance in the adjusted durables component resulted, mainly, from a larger-than-usual rise in transportation equipment. In that industry, nearly all components recorded above-average increases but the main factor was that employment levels in the motor vehicle industry in September were higher than those existing prior to the layoffs. Smaller-than-seasonal declines in wood and in iron and steel products also contributed to the advance in durables.

There were increases in the seasonally-adjusted indexes for all provinces and regions in September except those for Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island. The only significant advance, however, occurred in Ontario due to the rise in motor vehicles referred to above.

The industrial composite average of weekly wages and salaries for September, at \$84.02, was up 74 cents from August. The September figure was \$2.62 above the same month last year. The payroll index for September 1963, at 256.6, was 0.8 p.c. above August 1963 and 6.2 p.c. higher than September 1962.
