The November unadjusted index of employment (1961 = 100) decreased by 0.5 p.c. from 124.8 in October to 124.2 in November and was 0.3 p.c. higher than in November of last year. Seasonally-adjusted, the index at 122.5 was 0.2 p.c. higher than the figure for last month.

Seasonally-adjusted employment indexes. Among the industry divisions, the largest changes were decreases of 3.6 p.c. in forestry and 2.0 p.c. in service. The durable goods component of manufacturing showed an increase of 1.2 p.c. and in construction a rise of 1.0 p.c. was recorded. Other changes were small. Among the regions, British Columbia and Quebec showed decreases while all other regions showed increases ranging from 0.2 p.c. in the Prairie Region to 0.8 p.c. in Ontario.

Average Weekly Wages and Salaries. At the composite level, average weekly wages and salaries in November showed a slight increase over October and were \$6.37 higher than in November of last year. All industry divisions showed increases over October except trade where a slight decrease was recorded. Changes among the regions were slight.
