ADVANCE STATEMENT ON EMPLOYMENT AND AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGES AND SALARIES
(These data are subject to revision)

The May unadjusted composite index of employment (1961*100) increased to 122.0 from 119.3 in April and was 1.4 p.c. higher than in May of last year. Seasonallyadjusted, the index at 122.2 was $0.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. lower than last month.

Seasonally-adjusted employment indexes. - Among the industry divisions, decreasez were recorded in forestry, construction and manufacturing. All other industry divisions showed increases except mining, where there was no change. All regions showed declines except Quebec, where a $1.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Increase was recorded. The largest decrease was in the Atlantic Region (1.5 p.c.).

Average weekly wages and salaries. - At the composite level, average weekly wages and salaries at $\$ 102.12$ were slightly lower than in April and $\$ 6.13$ higher than in May of last year. Among the industry divisions, the largest change from last month was a decrease in forestry. Changes in other industry divisions were small. Among the regions, a decline of $\$ 1.62$ was recorded in the Atlantic Region. Elsewhere, changes were negligible.
