## ADVANCE STATEMENT ON EMPLOYMENT AND AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGES AND SALARIES



JUNE 1967

The June unadjusted composite index of employment ( $1961=100$ ) increased to 125.0 from 122.3 in May and was 0.6 pec. higher than in June of last year. Seasonally-adjusted, the index at 121.7 was 0.7 pec. lower than last month.

Seasonally-adjusted employment indexes. Among the industry divisions, increases were recorded in trade and finance, insurance and real estate. All other industry divisions showed decreases except service, where there was no change, All regions showed declines except the Prairie Region, where a 0.2 pec. Increase was recorded. The largest decrease was in the Atlantic Region (1.2 p.c.).

Average weekly wages and salaries. At the composite level, average weekly wages and salaries at $\$ 102.98$ were slight y higher than in May and $\$ 7.02$ higher than in June of last year. All industry divisions showed small increases over May except forestry, where a decrease was recorded. All regions showed slight increases, the largest change being $\$ 1.69$ in the Prairie Region.
