## ADVANCE STATEMENT ON EMPLOYMENT AND AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGES AND SALARIES

AUGUST 1967

(These data are subject to revision)

The August unadjusted composite index of employment (1961 = 100) increased to 126.7 from 125.8 in July and was 0.8 p.c. higher than in August of last year. Seasonally-adjusted, the index at 121.8 was 0.6 p.c. lower than last month.

Seasonally-adjusted employment indexes. - All industry divisions showed decreases from July except mining, where a 0.6 p.c. increase was recorded, and forestry, where there was no change. The largest decreases occurred in service (1.9 p.c.), transportation, communication and other utilities (0.8 p.c.) and construction (0.7 p.c.). All regions showed decreases except the Prairie Region. where a slight increase was recorded.

Average Weekly Wages and Salaries. - At the composite level, average weekly wages and salaries at \$103.43 were virtually unchanged from July and \$8.91 higher than in August of last year. Most industry divisions showed little change over July, the largest changes being a decrease of \$1.56 in forestry and an increase of \$1.21 in mining. Changes among the regions were negligible.
