

First Estimates(1) – February 1975

Seasonally-adjusted, the first estimate of the Canada industrial composite(2) index of employment (1961 = 100) dropped 0.6% from January to February. There were decreases in employment in all industry divisions except mining and transportation, communications and other utilities. All regions except Quebec showed reduced levels of employment.

Unadjusted for seasonal variations, average weekly earnings rose 0.9% at the Canada composite level to \$193.87. Gains occurred in all industry divisions except service and in all five regions.

Preliminary Data(1) – January 1975

Employment – (Seasonally-adjusted)

Preliminary data for January 1975 showed a 1.0% decline in employment at the *Canada* composite level. Decreases were recorded in all industry divisions except transportation, communications and other utilities, and trade.

Employment in manufacturing fell 2.3% from December to January. This represents the largest single-month decline since at least 1961. Some 60% of this decline was the result of layoffs in motor vehicles, especially in Ontario. In addition, there were declines in most other durable goods components and in food and beverages.

The decline in construction employment mainly reflected losses in both building and engineering in Quebec. Employment in service decreased by 0.5% mainly reflecting declines in business services and in hotels, restaurants and taverns. The 2.1% decline in forestry largely reflected layoffs in logging in British Columbia, while the 0.8% drop in mining employment was largely the result of industrial disputes in metals in British Columbia. Finance, insurance and real estate showed little change over the month.

Employment rose by 1.1% in both transportation, communications and other utilities and in trade from December to January. In the former, gains were widespread among all major components, while in the latter, the increases were concentrated in the retail component, largely in department stores.

In the *Atlantic Region*, the composite index of employment fell 1.0% in January as decreases in Newfoundland and New Brunswick offset gains in Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia. Employment declines in food and beverages, mainly fish products, and building and

Premières estimations(1) – Février 1975

Après désaisonnalisation, la première estimation de l'indice composite de l'emploi dans les activités économiques(2) du Canada (1961 = 100) a diminué de 0.6% entre janvier et février. Toutes les divisions d'activité économique ont connu un fléchissement de l'emploi, sauf les mines, les transports, communications et autres services publics. On a enregistré des baisses du niveau de l'emploi dans toutes les régions à l'exception du Québec.

Les gains hebdomadaires moyens non désaisonnalisés au niveau de l'ensemble des activités économiques du Canada ont augmenté de 0.9% pour s'établir à \$193.87. Des hausses se sont produites dans toutes les divisions d'activité économique (sans les services) et les cinq régions.

Données provisoires(1) – Janvier 1975

Emploi (chiffres désaisonnalisés)

Les données provisoires pour janvier 1975 révèlent un recul de 1% de l'indice composite de l'emploi *au Canada*. Les baisses sont survenues dans toutes les branches, sauf les transports, communications, et autres services publics et le commerce.

L'emploi dans le secteur de la fabrication a baissé de 2.3% entre décembre et janvier, soit la plus grande diminution pour un mois depuis au moins 1961. Quelque 60% de cette baisse s'est produite par suite de mises à pied dans le secteur de l'automobile, plus particulièrement en Ontario. En outre, on a enregistré des réductions dans la plupart des autres industries de biens durables et dans celles des aliments et boissons.

La baisse de l'emploi dans la construction s'explique principalement par les diminutions dans le bâtiment et le génie civil au Québec. Dans les services, l'emploi a fléchi de 0.5% surtout en raison des baisses enregistrées dans les services extérieurs des entreprises, les hôtels, restaurants et tavernes. La diminution de 2.1% observée dans l'industrie forestière traduit en grande partie les mises à pied de secteur de l'abattage en Colombie-Britannique, tandis que la baisse de 0.8% au niveau de l'emploi dans le secteur minier est survenue principalement à la suite de conflits du travail dans les mines métalliques de cette même province. Les finances, assurances et immeuble n'ont pas connu de variations notables.

L'emploi dans les transports, communications et autres services publics et le commerce a augmenté de 1.1% de décembre à janvier. Dans le premier cas, les progressions ont été généralisées dans toutes les principales branches, tandis que dans le second cas, les augmentations ont porté dans le secteur de détail, surtout les magasins à rayons.

L'indice composite de l'emploi dans la *région de l'Atlantique* a fléchi de 1.0% en janvier, car les baisses enregistrées à Terre-Neuve et au Nouveau-Brunswick ont neutralisé les hausses observées dans l'Île-du-Prince-Édouard et en Nouvelle-Écosse. Les baisses de l'emploi dans les

engineering construction more than offset gains in electric power and in retail trade, especially department stores.

The *Quebec* composite employment index dropped 0.6% from December to January. Employment in manufacturing declined 0.8% reflecting widespread layoffs in durable goods. The reduction in construction employment occurred in both building and engineering and followed unusually large increases in the previous month; these increases had reflected, in part, a changing seasonal pattern associated with the Christmas holiday season.

In *Ontario*, the composite index of employment dropped sharply by 1.4% from December to January. Some four-fifths of this decline was the result of large layoffs in motor vehicles associated with deteriorating market conditions. Declines in other components of durable goods, insurance and real estate, recreational and business services were somewhat offset by gains in communication, utilities and retail trade, especially department stores.

The industrial composite index of employment for the *Prairie Region* decreased 0.5% as declines in employment in Alberta more than offset slight rises in Manitoba and Saskatchewan. Employment was reduced in durables manufacturing, engineering construction and hotels, restaurants and taverns. Somewhat offsetting gains occurred in railway transport and department stores.

In *British Columbia*, the composite employment index rose 0.7% in January. Employment gains in transportation, especially railway transport, and in retail trade, largely department stores, more than offset declines in logging, metals mining and hotels, restaurants and taverns.

Earnings and Hours

Seasonally-adjusted, average weekly earnings rose 2.4% at the Canada industrial composite level in January. Gains occurred in all industry divisions and in all provinces.

Unadjusted for seasonal variations, average weekly earnings for the Canada composite rose 4.5% to \$192.11. All ten provinces contributed to the overall advance in the level of earnings; the increases ranged from 3.5% in Manitoba and British Columbia to 8.1% in New Brunswick.

In *forestry*, average weekly earnings jumped 21.7% from December to January mainly reflecting larger than seasonal increases in hours worked in Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia.

Average weekly earnings in *mining* rose from \$257.52 in December to \$262.66 in January as the result of gains in all component industries. Average weekly hours of hourly-rated wage-earners increased from 39.8 to 40.4, while average hourly earnings showed almost no change.

aliments et boissons, particulièrement les produits du poisson, et le bâtiment et le génie civil ont plus que compensé les gains du secteur de l'énergie électrique et du commerce de détail, surtout les magasins à rayons.

Au *Québec*, l'indice composite de l'emploi a baissé de 0.6% de décembre à janvier. L'emploi dans le secteur de la fabrication a diminué de 0.8% par suite de mises à pied généralisées dans les biens durables. La baisse de l'emploi dans la construction est survenue dans le bâtiment et le génie civil et a fait suite aux augmentations exceptionnellement fortes observées le mois précédent; ces augmentations ont expliqué en partie la variation saisonnière liée aux congés de la période de Noël.

L'indice composite de l'emploi en *Ontario* a fait une chute marquée de 1.4% de décembre à janvier. Près des quatre-cinquièmes de cette baisse s'expliquent par les importantes mises à pied dans le secteur de l'automobile en raison des mauvaises conditions du marché. Les baisses dans les autres composantes des biens durables, les finances, assurances et immeuble, les services récréatifs et extérieurs des entreprises ont été quelque peu compensées par des gains dans les communications, les services publics et le commerce de détail, surtout les magasins à rayons.

Dans la *région des Prairies*, l'indice composite de l'emploi a régressé de 0.5%, car les baisses de l'emploi en Alberta ont plus que neutralisé les faibles hausses observées au Manitoba et en Saskatchewan. L'emploi a diminué dans la fabrication des biens durables, le génie civil et les hôtels, restaurants et tavernes. Des gains quelque peu compensatoires ont survenus dans le transport ferroviaire et les magasins à rayons.

En *Colombie-Britannique*, l'indice composite de l'emploi a augmenté de 0.7% en janvier. Les gains de l'emploi dans le secteur des transports, particulièrement le transport ferroviaire, et dans le commerce de détail, surtout les magasins à rayons, ont plus que compensé les diminutions observées dans les branches de l'abattage, les mines métalliques et les hôtels, restaurants et tavernes.

Gains et heures

Après désaisonnalisation, les gains hebdomadaires moyens ont progressé de 2.4% en janvier au niveau de l'ensemble des activités économiques du Canada. Des hausses se sont produites dans toutes les branches et dans toutes les provinces.

Les gains hebdomadaires moyens *non désaisonnalisés* pour l'ensemble des activités économiques du Canada ont augmenté de 4.5% pour s'établir à \$192.11. Toutes les dix provinces ont contribué à cette hausse globale des gains; les augmentations se sont échelonnées entre 3.5% au Manitoba et en Colombie-Britannique et 8.1% au Nouveau-Brunswick.

Dans *l'industrie forestière*, les gains hebdomadaires moyens ont fait un bond de 21.7% de décembre à janvier, traduisant en grande partie des hausses de la durée du travail au Québec, en Ontario et en Colombie-Britannique plus importantes que les hausses saisonnières.

Les gains hebdomadaires moyens dans les *mines* sont passés de \$257.52 en décembre à \$262.66 en janvier par suite de progressions dans toutes les branches d'activité. La durée hebdomadaire moyenne du travail des ouvriers rémunérés à l'heure est passée de 39.8 à 40.4, alors que les gains horaires moyens restaient pratiquement inchangés.

In *manufacturing*, average weekly earnings rose 4.8% in January to \$201.91 mainly reflecting the seasonal increase in hours worked in both durables and non-durables. Average weekly hours rose from 36.8 to 38.6, while average hourly earnings gained 5 cents to \$4.76.

Average weekly earnings in *construction* rebounded from the seasonal decline in December with a 12.4% rise in January. Average weekly hours rose from 34.4 in December to 38.0 in January. Average hourly earnings gained more than 4% with increases in both building and engineering.

In *transportation, communications and other utilities*, average weekly earnings rose 3.6% to \$222.80 mainly reflecting gains in transportation and utilities. Average weekly earnings in trade rose from \$146.72 to \$149.53 largely owing to increases in the wholesale component.

In *finance, insurance and real estate*, average weekly earnings rose 2.7% as a result of gains in both components, while in *service*, average weekly earnings rose 3.1% to \$136.64 reflecting widespread advances in all component industries.

Dans le secteur de la *fabrication*, les gains hebdomadaires moyens ont augmenté de 4.8% en janvier pour s'établir à \$201.91 surtout à cause de la hausse saisonnière des heures travaillées dans le secteur des biens durables et non durables. La durée hebdomadaire moyenne du travail est passée de 36.8 à 38.6, tandis que les gains moyens progressaient de 5 cents pour se fixer à \$4.76.

Les gains hebdomadaires moyens dans la *construction* ont augmenté de façon très appréciable (12.4%) en janvier, comparativement à la diminution saisonnière observée en décembre. La durée hebdomadaire moyenne est passée de 34.4 en décembre à 38,0 en janvier. Les gains horaires moyens se sont accrus de plus de 4%, les augmentations se situant dans le secteur du bâtiment et le génie civil.

Dans les *transports, communications et autres services publics*, les gains hebdomadaires moyens ont augmenté de 3.6% pour s'établir à \$222.80 surtout en raison de hausse dans les transports et les services publics. Les gains hebdomadaires moyens dans le secteur du commerce sont passés de \$146.72 à \$149.53 en grande partie par suite d'augmentations dans le commerce de gros.

Les *finances, assurances et immeuble* ont connu une hausse de 2.7% de leurs gains hebdomadaires moyens à la suite d'augmentations des deux groupes, tandis que dans les *services*, les gains hebdomadaires moyens ont progressé de 3.1% pour s'établir à \$136.64, reflétant ainsi des hausses générales dans toutes les branches d'activité.

1974 in Review

Employment

The average of the twelve monthly indexes for 1974, compared with the same period for 1973, showed a 5.2% advance in the industrial composite employment index for Canada; this was 0.6 percentage point larger than the gain experienced from 1972 to 1973. The largest increases were in service (8.7%), trade (6.8%) and construction (6.6%). All provinces showed higher levels of employment; the increases ranged from 4.5% in Quebec and Ontario to 8.2% in Saskatchewan and Alberta.

Earnings

The twelve-month average of 1974 data, compared with the same period for 1973, showed an 11.0% rise in average weekly earnings at the Canada composite level. The industrial increases ranged from 10.2% in service to 13.0% in mining; the provincial gains ranged from 9.6% in Ontario to 15.4% in New Brunswick.

Revue de 1974

Emploi

La moyenne des indices pour douze mois en 1974 par rapport à la même période en 1973 fait ressortir une progression de 5.2% de l'emploi au niveau de toutes les activités économiques du Canada; il s'agit là d'une avance de 0.6 point sur la progression observée de 1972 à 1973. Les augmentations les plus importantes sont survenues dans les services (8.7%), le commerce (6.8%) et la construction (6.6%). Toutes les provinces ont indiqué des niveaux d'emploi plus élevés; les hausses se sont échelonnées entre 4.5% au Québec et en Ontario et 8.2% en Saskatchewan et en Alberta.

Gains

En comparant la moyenne sur douze mois des données pour 1974 avec celle de 1973, on constate une hausse de 11.0% des gains hebdomadaires moyens au niveau de l'ensemble des activités économiques du Canada. Les augmentations par branche d'activité ont varié entre 10.2% dans les services et 13.0% dans les mines; par province, les gains ont fluctué entre 9.6% en Ontario et 15.4% au Nouveau-Brunswick.









CONCEPTS AND METHODS

Each month the Monthly Employment, Payrolls and Labour Income Section of the Labour Division, through a mail survey, collects information on employment, earnings and hours which are tabulated to present the data in this report. Data which, prior to March 1971, were published separately in "Employment and Average Weekly Wages and Salaries" (Catalogue 72-002) and in "Man-Hours and Hourly Earnings" (Catalogue 72-003) have been combined in this report. The following notes explain the concepts and methods used in the survey.

Reporting Unit

The reporting unit is usually the establishment, that is, the smallest industrial unit which is a separate operating entity capable of reporting all elements of basic industrial statistics including information on inputs and outputs needed to calculate "value added" or "gross mark-up" or "gross profit" as well as data on employment and payrolls. For purposes of detailed geographic statistics, the Section often requests that the reporting unit be a sub-establishment unit which, although not capable of reporting all basic statistics, can report employment and payroll data for that particular location.

Generally, the survey covers larger companies only, that is, companies having 20 or more employees in any month of the year. However, all the establishments of a multi-establishment company are included if the company had 20 or more employees in total in any month of the year even though any single establishment may have had only a few employees.

Reference Period

Conceptually, the figures refer to the last seven days in the specified months. In practice, few establishments keep payroll records covering precisely this period and establishments are therefore permitted to report for their last pay period or pay periods in each month.

When the reported pay period is longer than one week, the payroll data are reduced to one week's proportion of the totals. The numerators of the fractions used in calculating these weekly equivalents are 5, 6 or 7, depending on the number of working days per week in which the establishment operated in the pay period. The denominators of the fractions are the number of working days in the different pay periods. For employees paid at annual or monthly rates, whose earnings are not affected by the number of working days in the month, fixed proportions are used to reduce the earnings to a weekly basis, without regard to the length of the calendar month.

When a holiday, layoff or industrial dispute occurs in an establishment that reports a pay period that is different from the last seven days of the month, an adjustment is made to the data, if the holiday, layoff or dispute affects the two periods differently, so that the data accurately reflects the actual situation during the reference period.

Coverage

All industries are covered by the survey, with the exceptions of agriculture, fishing and trapping, education and related services, health and welfare services, religious organizations, private households and public administration and defence. Because of the limitation of the survey to larger firms, there is somewhat uneven coverage of total employment by industry as well as by province and urban area. The percentage of total employment covered depends on the propor-

CONCEPTS ET MÉTHODES

En règle générale, l'enquête vise seulement les grandes entreprises, c'est-à-dire les entreprises employant 20 employés ou plus au cours de n'importe quel mois de l'année. Période de référence

En théorie, l'enquête vise les chiffres des sept derniers jours des mois de référence. Geographic Classification

Reporting units are assigned to a province, a county (as defined by the Census of Population) and, where applicable, to an urban area. Data for Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick are aggregated in some tables to give statistics for the Atlantic Region. Similarly, data for Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta are added together to provide totals for the Prairie Region. The Census of Population's "Metropolitan Area" definitions were used for the nineteen applicable urban areas. The definitions used for other urban areas are based on a labour market concept; the areas usually include the surrounding territory as well as the urban centre. A list showing the territory included in each

Classification géographique

Les unités de déclaration sont affectées à une province, à un comté (selon la définition établie par le recensement de la population) et, s'il y a lieu, à une région urbaine. Les données de Terre-Neuve, de l'Île-du-Prince-Édouard, de la Nouvelle-Écosse et du Nouveau-Brunswick sont agrégées dans certains tableaux présentant des statistiques pour la région de l'Atlantique. De la même manière, les données du Manitoba, de la Saskatchewan et de l'Alberta sont additionnées pour former le total de la région des Prairies. On a retenu la définition de "région métropolitaine" établie pour le recensement de la population dans le cas des dix-neuf régions urbaines. tabulated urban area is available from the Monthly Employment, Payrolls and Labour Income Section. The reporting units not located in a tabulated urban area are included in county, provincial and regional totals.

Industrial Classification

All establishments are assigned to an industrial class on the basis of their principal activity. If an establishment is engaged in a number of different industrial activities, its principal activity is determined by the largest net value added by these activities, or where this is not possible, by the gross revenue obtained from the different activities. When an establishment has very mixed activities, it is not necessarily shifted from industry to industry each time its principal activity changes.

Statistics from the survey are based on the 1960 Standard Industrial Classification. A description of the various industries and groups of industries may be found in the "Standard Industrial Classification Manual", Catalogue 12-501 (1960). The "S.I.C. code" columns in the main tables refer to this manual. The tables contain a few groupings not found in the Standard Industrial Classification. These include:

Industrial composite (031-899) - The sum of the industries included in the survey. (see Coverage)

Durable goods manufacturing (durable) - The sum of wood products (S.I.C. 250-259), furniture and fixtures (S.I.C. 260-269), primary metal industries (S.I.C. 290-298), metal fabricating industries (S.I.C. 300-309), machinery (except electrical) (S.I.C. 310-318), transportation equipment (S.I.C. 320-329), electrical products (S.I.C. 330-339), and non-metallic mineral products (S.I.C. 340-359).

Non-durable goods manufacturing (non-dur) - The sum of food and beverages (S.I.C. 100-147), tobacco processing and products (S.I.C. 150-153), rubber products (S.I.C. 160-169), leather products (S.I.C. 170-179), textile products (S.I.C. 180-229), knitting mills (S.I.C. 230-239), clothing (S.I.C. 240-249), paper and allied industries (S.I.C. 270-274), printing, publishing and allied industries (S.I.C. 280-289), petroleum and coal products (S.I.C. 360-369), chemicals and chemical products (S.I.C. 370-379), and miscellaneous manufacturing industries (S.I.C. 380-399).

Building (404,421) - The sum of general contractors (S.I.C. 404) and special trade contractors (S.I.C. 421).

Engineering (406-409) - The sum of highway, bridge and street construction (S.I.C. 406) and other construction (S.I.C. 409).

In addition, the synthetic textile industry (201) is subdivided into spun yarn and fabrics (2011) and filament yarn and staple fibres (2012).

Employment

Employment data represent all employees on the payrolls of reporting units in the reference period. The employee concept excludes working owners or partners in unincorporated businesses, non-working directors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, persons doing non-remunerative volunteer work, pensioners, home workers,

Classification par activité économique

Tous les établissements appartiennent à une branche d'activité économique, qui est déterminée en fonction de leur activité principale. Si un établissement a plusieurs activités économiques, son activité principale est déterminée par la plus grande valeur nette ajoutée de ces activités, ou si cela n'est pas possible, par les recettes brutes au titre des différentes activités. Si un établissement exerce des activités très diverses, on ne le transfère pas nécessairement d'une branche à l'autre chaque fois que son activité principale change.

Les statistiques tirées de l'enquête sont fondées sur la Classification type des industries de 1960. On peut trouver une description des diverses activités économiques et groupes d'activités économiques dans le "Manuel de la classification type des industries", n° 12-501 au catalogue (1960). Les colonnes "code de la C.T.I." des principaux tableaux renvoient à ce manuel. Les tableaux renferment quelques groupements qui ne se trouvent pas dans la Classification type des industries. Manufactures, biens non durables (non dur.) - L'ensemble de l'industrie des aliments et boissons (C.T.I. 100-147), de l'industrie du traitement et des produits du tabac (C.T.I. 150-153), de l'industrie des produits du caoutchouc (C.T.I. 160-169), de l'industrie des produits du cuir (C.T.I. 170-179), de l'industrie des produits du textile (C.T.I. 180-229), de l'industrie de la bonneterie (C.T.I. 230-239), de l'industrie du vêtement (C.T.I. 240-249), de l'industrie du papier et des produits connexes (C.T.I. 270-274) de l'imprimerie, de l'édition et des industries connexes (C.T.I. 280-289), de l'industrie du pétrole, du charbon et de leurs dérivés (C.T.I. 360-369), de l'industrie chimique et des produits connexes (C.T.I. 370-379) et des industries manufacturières diverses (C.T.I. 380-399).

Bâtiment (404, 421) - L'ensemble des entrepreneurs généraux (C.T.I. 404) et des entrepreneurs spécialisés (C.T.I. 421).

Genie civil (C.T.I. 406-409) - L'ensemble de la construction de routes, ponts et rues (C.T.I. 406) et des autres constructions (C.T.I. 409).

En outre, l'industrie des textiles synthétiques (201) est subdivisée en filés et tissus (2011) et en filés de filaments et fibres discontinues (2012).

Emploi

Les données sur l'emploi représentent tous les employés inscrits aux registres de paye des unités de déclaration au cours de la période de référence. Le concept d'employé exclut les propriétaires actifs ou partenaires d'entreprises non constituées en corporation, les membres des conseils d'administration qui ne travaillent pas dans l'entreprise, les travailleurs

and persons providing services to an establishment on the basis of a contract for services. Counted as employed, therefore, are all wage-earners and salaried employees who are paid for their services or are on paid absence during the reference period, except for casual employees working less than seven hours in the pay period. *Regular part-time* employees are treated as employed regardless of the number of hours worked during the pay period.

For example, an employee working for a part of the reference period and unemployed or on strike for the rest, is counted as employed. Employees not receiving pay for the entire reference period because of strike or as a consequence of a strike, or those persons on leave without pay, are not included among the employed.

Wage-earners

Wage-earners are defined by occupation rather than by the method of payment. They are those employees engaged in actual production and related operations, including maintenance, warehouse and delivery staffs, security staff, routemen, driver-salesmen, sales clerks in retail stores, waitresses, and working foremen performing functions similar to those of the employees whom they supervise, etc. Wage-earners may be paid a fixed monthly amount or on the basis of hours worked. The survey covers all wage-earners regardless of the method of payment and average weekly wages are computed for all. However, derivations of average weekly hours and average hourly earnings are based only upon data for wage-earners for whom hours data are available.

Salaried Employees

Salaried employees constitute executive, administrative, supervisory, technical and professional personnel, commission agents, and travelling salesmen directly responsible to the administration, as well as general office, clerical and related workers in the office and plant. In addition, working directors of incorporated businesses are included in this category.

Earnings

Earnings of wage-earners and salaried employees represent gross pay for the week, before deductions for taxes, unemployment insurance contributions, etc. Gross pay includes salaries, straight time wages, piecework and regular commission earnings, regularly paid incentive, cost of living and other bonuses, overtime earnings and payments to persons absent with pay in the survey week. The payroll concept does not include supplementary labour costs such as employers' contributions to unemployment insurance, medical plans, Workmen's Compensation and other welfare plans, nor does it include the cost of equipment, the value of room and board, compensation in kind, travelling expenses, retirement gratuities, bonuses paid at irregular and infrequent intervals or directors' fees.

The term "earnings" is used to denote the total of weekly wages of the wage-earners and salaries of the salaried employees. The publications prior to March 1971 contained this combined data entitled "Average Weekly Wages and Salaries". These data are comparable with "Average Weekly Earnings" of total employees in

Les employés qui ne sont pas rémunérés pour toute la période de référence à cause d'une grève ou des conséquences d'une grève, ou les personnes en congé sans paye ne figurent pas parmi les personnes occupées.

Employés à salaire

L'employé à salaire est défini par la nature du travail plutôt que par le mode de rémunération. Les employés à salaire sont les personnes travaillant effectivement à la production et à des opérations assimilées, en particulier le personnel d'entretien, d'entrepôt et de livraison, le personnel de sécurité, les chauffeurs-livreurs, les vendeurs itinérants, les commis des magasins de détail, les serveuses et les contremaîtres remplissant des fonctions analogues à celles des employés dont ils ont la charge, etc. Les employés à salaire peuvent être rémunérés sur une base mensuelle fixe ou suivant le nombre d'heures travaillées. L'enquête couvre tous les employés à salaire quel que soit leur mode de rémunération et les gains hebdomadaires moyens sont calculés pour tous. Toutefois, les heures hebdomadaires moyennes et les rémunérations horaires moyennes sont calculées uniquement d'après les données relatives aux employés à salaire dont on peut connaître le nombre d'heures de travail.

Employés à traitement

Les employés à traitement comprennent les directeurs, les administrateurs, les surveillants, les cadres techniques et spécialisés, les agents à la commission, les voyageurs de commerce relevant directement de l'administration, ainsi que les employés de bureau, les commis et les travailleurs assimilés, au bureau et à l'usine. Les membres des conseils d'administration d'entreprises constituées en corporation qui travaillent dans l'entreprise sont également compris dans cette catégorie.

Rémunération

Les rémunérations des employés à salaire et des employés à traitement représentent les gains bruts de la semaine, avant toutes déductions d'impôt, de cotisations d'assurance-chômage, etc. La rémunération brute comprend les salaires, la rémunération au taux ordinaire, la rémunération du travail aux pièces et les commissions régulières, les primes au rendement, les primes de vie chère et autres gratifications versées régulièrement, les gains pour travail supplémentaire et les paiements versés aux personnes en congé payé pendant la semaine de l'enquête. Le concept de rémunération ne comprend pas les frais supplémentaires de main-d'oeuvre tels que les cotisations de l'employeur à la caisse d'assurance-chômage, aux régimes d'assurance-maladie, à la caisse d'indemnisation des accidents de travail et à d'autres régimes de prévoyance; il ne comprend pas non plus le coût du matériel, la valeur de la pension, les paiements en nature, les frais de déplacement, les indemnités de retraite, les gratifications versées à intervalles irréguliers et peu fréquents ni les jetons de présence des administrateurs.

Le terme "rémunérations" désigne l'ensemble des gains des employés à salaire et des employés à traitement. the present publication. The system now provides separate earnings data for all wage-earners and salaried employees whereas formerly only "Average Weekly Wages" for hourly-rated wage-earners was available.

Index Numbers

Index numbers are calculated by dividing the current month's employment (or payroll) by the monthly-average of the total base year employment (or payroll). The current employment consists of all employment reported by establishments that meet our size criteria in the current period. Base year employment consists of the employment of establishments that had 20 or more employees in any month of 1961. The payroll index is calculated in a similar fashion.

Seasonally-adjusted index numbers remove from the employment indexes those regularly recurring fluctuations known as "seasonal variations". The adjusted index numbers thus approximate the trend, cycle, and irregular components of the time series. The X-11 variant of the U.S. Census Method II is used to calculate the seasonally-adjusted index numbers; additional seasonally-adjusted series may be found in "Employment, earnings and hours, seasonally-adjusted series January 1961 - December 1971" (Catalogue 72-206).

Averages

The average weekly hours figure is obtained by dividing total weekly man-hours by the number of wage-earners who worked those hours. Average hourly earnings are obtained by dividing total weekly wages of hourly-rated wage-earners by their total weekly hours. Both of these averages apply only to the subset of wage-earners for whom hourly details are reported. It should be noted that total hours include overtime hours actually worked and that the wage-earner total includes part-time wage-earners and casuals working more than seven hours during one week. Annual statistics are calculated from the aggregate of the monthly data, with the exception of those shown as preliminary (p); the latter are based on monthly averages.

Statistical Presentation

Each month, statistics for three months are prepared by the Monthly Employment, Payrolls and Labour Income Section. Data for the first, most current month, are entitled first estimates. They are based on a limited number of returns (usually about 50%) and only highly aggregated figures are released in the Statistics Canada Daily and the First Estimates table of this publication. Simultaneously, second estimates are prepared for the month immediately preceding the most current data and third estimates for the month prior to that. Both of these latter estimates are of higher quality than that of the first because of the higher rate of returns (typically, 65% and 75%, respectively). Consequently full details for both months are shown within this publication.

After completion of the third estimate, further revisions to the data are made to incorporate late returns and corrected information received from our respondents or to rectify mechanical errors. Larger corrections are calculated immediately and appear in the historical and special tables and in column for the previous year in tables 2, 3 and 4 of this publication. The smaller corrections are completed in the annual tabulations when all returns are retabulated to produce revised figures and annual averages; these data are contained in catalogue 72-201 and 72-202.

Nombres-indices

On obtient les nombres-indices en divisant le nombre total d'employés (ou la rémunération) du mois courant par la moyenne mensuelle du nombre d'employés (ou de la rémunération) de l'année de base. Le nombre courant d'employés est l'ensemble des employés déclarés par les établissements dont la taille répond à notre critère pendant la période courante. Le nombre d'employés pour l'année de base est le nombre d'employés des établissements employant 20 employés ou plus pendant n'importe quel mois de l'année 1961. L'indice de la rémunération est calculé de la même manière.

La désaisonnalisation des nombres-indices a pour effet d'éliminer des indices de l'emploi les fluctuations qui se produisent à intervalles réguliers et qui s'appellent variations saisonnières. Les nombres-indices désaisonnalisés représentent donc assez bien la tendance, le cycle et les composantes irrégulières de la série chronologique. La variante X-11 de la méthode II du recensement des Etats-Unis est utilisée pour calculer les nombres-indices désaisonnalisés; on peut trouver d'autres séries désaisonnalisées dans "Emploi, rémunérations et heures, séries désaisonnalisées janvier 1961-décembre 1971" (n° 72-206 au catalogue).

Moyennes

On calcule les heures hebdomadaires moyennes en divisant le nombre total d'heures-hommes par le nombre d'employés à salaire qui ont fait ces heures. On obtient les rémunérations horaires moyennes en divisant la rémunération hebdomadaire totale des employés à salaire rémunérés à l'heure par le nombre total de leurs heures par semaine. Ces deux moyennes s'appliquent seulement aux employés à salaire dont le nombre d'heures est déclaré. À remarquer que le nombre total d'heures comprend les heures supplémentaires réelles et que le total des employés à salaire comprend les employés à salaire à temps partiel et les occasionnels qui travaillent plus de sept heures par semaine. À l'exception des statistiques provisoires (p), qui sont fondées sur les moyennes mensuelles, les statistiques annuelles sont établies à partir de l'ensemble des données mensuelles.

Présentation statistique

Chaque mois, la Section des statistiques mensuelles sur l'emploi, la rémunération et le revenu du travail prépare des statistiques pour trois mois. Les données du premier mois, le mois le plus récent, sont appelées "premières estimations". Elles sont fondées sur un nombre limité de déclarations (environ 50%) et seuls des chiffres très généraux sont publiés dans Le Quotidien de Statistique Canada et dans le tableau "Premières estimations" de la présente publication. En même temps, la Section prépare des deuxièmes estimations pour le mois qui précède le mois le plus récent, et des troisièmes estimations pour le mois qui précède celui-là. Ces deux dernières estimations sont de meilleure qualité que les premières en raison de la disponibilité d'un plus grand nombre de réponses (d'habitude 65% pour les deuxièmes estimations et 75% pour les troisièmes). Par conséquent, la présente publication contient tous les détails pour ces deux mois.

Une fois terminées les troisièmes estimations, on effectue d'autres rectifications à la lumière des déclarations des retardataires et des corrections reçues de nos enquêtés, ou par suite de la correction de certaines erreurs mécaniques. Les corrections les plus importantes sont effectuées immédiatement; elles paraissent dans les tableaux chronologiques et spéciaux ainsi que dans la colonne de l'année précédente aux tableaux 2, 3 et 4 de la présente publication. Les corrections de moindre importance sont effectuées dans les tableaux annuels quand toutes les réponses ont été totalisées de nouveau en vue de la production de chiffres et de moyennes annuelles rectifiés; ces données sont publiées dans les publications 72-201 et 72-202.


