

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COMMENTARY

First Estimates(1) – November 1979
(Seasonally Adjusted)

The first estimate of the Canada industrial composite(2) index of employment (1961 = 100) for November 1979 showed a 0.1% decrease from October 1979. Manufacturing and construction decreased while the remaining industry divisions increased. The Atlantic region and Quebec declined while the other regions reported increases.

Average weekly earnings, at the national industrial composite level, declined by 0.1%. Gains were registered in mining (including milling), manufacturing, trade and service while the remaining industry divisions reported decreases. All regions increased with the exception of Quebec and the Prairie region.

Preliminary Data – October 1979

Employment

Seasonally adjusted, preliminary data for October increased by 0.1% at the Canada industrial composite index of employment. Mining (including milling), manufacturing, construction and trade registered decreases while the remaining industry divisions increased. All regions registered gains with the exception of the Atlantic region and Ontario which decreased.

Earnings and Hours

Seasonally adjusted, average weekly earnings rose by 0.2% at the national industrial composite level. All industry divisions participated in the increase except construction, transportation, communication and other utilities and service which declined and forestry which remained unchanged. All regions posted increases, except Quebec which declined.

Unadjusted, average weekly earnings rose by 0.3% to \$296.97 at the Canada industrial composite level. Average hourly earnings increased by 21 cents in mining (including milling) to \$10.03, by 8 cents in manufacturing to \$7.65 and by 3 cents in construction to \$11.38. Average weekly hours increased in mining (including milling) but decreased in manufacturing and in construction.

(2) Industrial Composite is the sum for all industries with the exception of agriculture, fishing and trapping, education and related services, health and welfare services, religious organizations, private households and public administration and defence. All statistics are based on returns received from employers having twenty or more employees in any month of the year.

OBSERVATIONS

Premières estimations(1) – novembre 1979
(chiffres désaisonnalisés)

Les premières estimations de l'emploi pour l'ensemble des industries(2) du Canada révèlent une baisse de 0.1% d'octobre à novembre 1979. Les manufactures et la construction ont subi des pertes alors que les autres divisions de l'activité économique ont enregistré des gains. On a observé des gains dans toutes les régions sauf dans la région de l'Atlantique et le Québec.

Les gains hebdomadaires moyens ont diminué de 0.1% au niveau de l'ensemble des industries du Canada. On a observé des gains dans les mines (y compris le broyage), dans les manufactures, dans le commerce et dans les services alors que les autres divisions de l'activité économique ont connu des baisses. Toutes les régions ont augmenté sauf le Québec et la région des Prairies.

Données provisoires – octobre 1979

Emploi

Après désaisonnalisation, les données pour octobre 1979 montrent une augmentation de 0.1% au niveau de l'ensemble des industries du Canada. Les mines (y compris le broyage), les manufactures, la construction et le commerce ont subi des pertes alors que les autres divisions de l'activité économique ont affiché des gains. La région de l'Atlantique et l'Ontario ont affiché des baisses alors que les autres régions ont progressé.


Gains et heures de travail

Les gains hebdomadaires moyens, désaisonnalisés, se sont accrus de 0.2% au niveau de l'ensemble des industries du Canada. Toutes les divisions de l'activité économique ont participé à cette hausse à l'exception de la construction, des transports, communications et autres services publics et des services qui ont subi une baisse et du forestage qui n'a pas varié. Exception faite du Québec qui a régressé, toutes les régions ont progressé.

Les gains hebdomadaires moyens, non désaisonnalisés, ont affiché une hausse de 0.3% pour atteindre \$296.97 au niveau de l'ensemble des industries du Canada. Les gains horaires moyens ont augmenté de 21 cents dans les mines (y compris le broyage) (\$10.03), de 8 cents dans les manufactures (\$7.65) et de 3 cents dans la construction (\$11.38). Le nombre moyen d'heures hebdomadaires travaillées a augmenté dans les mines (y compris le broyage) mais a diminué dans les manufactures et la construction.

(2) L'ensemble des industries comprend toutes les branches d'activité sauf l'agriculture, la pêche et le piégeage, l'enseignement et services connexes, les services d'hygiène et de bien-être, les organisations religieuses, les ménages privés, et l'administration publique et la défense. Toutes les statistiques sont fondées sur les déclarations envoyées par les employeurs comptant au moins vingt salariés au cours d'un mois quelconque de l'année.



Indices de l'emploi, industries de biens, Canada



CONCEPTS AND METHODS

Objectives

The Monthly Employment, Payrolls and Manhours survey is designed to measure the month-to-month trends of employment, paid hours and earnings for the commercial sector of the economy with the exclusion of agriculture, fishing and trapping.

These measures are expressed in an index form for employment and as weekly averages for earnings and hours paid for. The data are compiled and published at detailed industrial and geographic levels.

Source of Data

The statistics contained in this report are based on information obtained through a mail census of "larger firms".

The firm is defined as any business entity whether incorporated or not; it comprises sole proprietorships, partnerships, corporations and other forms of organization such as co-operatives. Most firms consist of only one "establishment" (see definition under Industrial Classification) but in some cases the firm is made up of a number of establishments which may or may not be engaged in the same kind of economic activity.

A firm is considered as "larger" when it employs 20 or more persons in any one month of the year. Although the intent of the survey is to cover all such firms, it also includes some firms with less than 20 employees and excludes some firms with more than 20 employees; the reason is that, in practice, it is not always possible to capture promptly enough employment fluctuations in individual firms.

Universe

The universe for the survey is derived from a central file of employers maintained by the Business Register and Profiling Division of Statistics Canada.

Coverage

All commercial industries are covered by the survey, with the exception of agriculture, fishing and trapping; by definition such non-commercial sectors as education and related services, health and welfare services, religious organizations, private households and public administration and defense are excluded. Because the survey is limited to "larger firms", the proportion of total employment covered by the survey varies among industries, provinces and urban areas. The following table shows annual employment as reported in the survey as a percentage of the estimated total number of employees, the latter being estimated by adding together data from the Employment, Payrolls and Manhours survey and data from a sample survey of smaller firms plus supplementary surveys. Estimates of the total number of employees are published in "Estimates of Employees by Province and Industry" (Catalogue 72-008).

CONCEPTS ET METHODES

Objectifs

L'enquête mensuelle sur l'emploi, la rémunération et les heures-hommes a pour objet de mesurer d'un mois à l'autre les tendances de l'emploi, des heures rémunérées et des gains touchés dans les secteurs commerciaux de l'économie à l'exception de l'agriculture, de la pêche et du piégeage.

Ces mesures sont exprimées sous forme d'indices dans le cas de l'emploi et de moyennes hebdomadaires dans le cas des gains touchés et des heures rémunérées. Les données sont rassemblées et publiées à des niveaux de détails raffinés selon l'activité économique et le lieu géographique.

Source des données

Les statistiques présentées dans ce bulletin sont fondées sur des renseignements obtenus au moyen d'un recensement postal des "grandes entreprises".

Le terme "entreprise" désigne toute entité commerciale constituée ou non en corporation; il peut s'agir d'une entreprise à propriétaire unique, d'une société en nom collectif, d'une corporation ou d'une autre forme d'organisation comme une coopérative. La plupart des entreprises ne comptent qu'un seul "établissement" (voir la définition sous la rubrique "Classement par activité économique") mais, dans certains cas, l'entreprise peut regrouper plusieurs établissements qui exercent ou non le même genre d'activité économique.

Une entreprise est considérée comme une "grande entreprise" si elle emploie 20 personnes ou plus pendant un mois quelconque de l'année. Bien que l'objet de l'enquête soit d'appréhender toutes les grandes entreprises, elle vise cependant quelques entreprises employant moins de 20 salariés et n'englobe pas toutes les entreprises comptant plus de 20 salariés, car, en pratique, il est presque toujours impossible de saisir rapidement toutes les fluctuations de l'emploi dans chacune des entreprises.

Univers

L'univers de l'enquête est établi à l'aide d'un registre central des employeurs tenu à jour par la Division des profils et du registre des entreprises de Statistique Canada.

Champ de l'enquête

L'enquête vise tous les secteurs commerciaux de l'activité économique à l'exception de l'agriculture, de la pêche et du piégeage; en sont donc exclus les secteurs non commerciaux comme l'enseignement et les services connexes, la santé et les oeuvres sociales, les organismes religieux, les ménages privés et l'administration publique et la défense. Étant donné que l'enquête ne vise que les "grandes entreprises", la proportion de l'emploi total qu'elle appréhende varie d'une branche d'activité, d'une province et d'une région urbaine à l'autre. Le tableau qui suit indique l'emploi annuel relevé par l'enquête, exprimé en pourcentage du nombre estimatif total de salariés, l'estimation de ce dernier chiffre étant calculée en additionnant les données de l'enquête sur l'emploi, la rémunération et les heures-hommes avec celles d'une enquête par sondage et d'enquêtes supplémentaires menées auprès des petites entreprises. Les estimations du nombre total de salariés sont publiées dans le bulletin intitulé "Estimations du nombre de salariés par province et par industrie" numéro 72-008 au catalogue.

Industrial Classification

All firms are assigned to an industry on the basis of their principal activity. In instances where the firm is engaged in only one kind of industrial activity, the industrial classification is straight forward. Classification problems arise when a firm is active in more than one kind of classifiable industrial activity. This usually occurs when a firm operates more than one establishment. The establishment, typically a factory, mine, store or a similar unit is defined, for statistical purposes, as the smallest separate operating entity capable of reporting all elements of basic industrial data which permit the calculation of "census value added" or "gross mark up" or "gross profit" as well as data on employment and payrolls.

For purposes of detailed geographical statistics, the establishment is often sub-divided into reporting units which, although not capable of reporting all basic industrial statistics, can report employment and payroll data for particular locations.

Classement par activité économique

Toutes les entreprises appartiennent à une branche d'activité économique qui est déterminée en fonction de leur activité principale. Si l'entreprise n'exerce qu'un seul genre d'activité économique, le classement est simple. Les problèmes surgissent lorsqu'elle en exerce plus d'un, par exemple lorsqu'elle possède plus d'un établissement. À des fins statistiques, on définit l'établissement, qui consiste habituellement en une usine, une mine, un magasin ou une unité semblable, comme la plus petite unité constituant un ensemble d'exploitation distinct en mesure de déclarer tous les éléments de base de la statistique des activités économiques, qui permettent de calculer la "valeur ajoutée" ou la "majoration brute" ou le "bénéfice brut", ainsi que des données sur l'emploi et la rémunération.

Pour permettre d'obtenir des statistiques géographiques détaillées, l'établissement est souvent subdivisé en unités déclarantes qui, bien qu'elles ne puissent fournir toutes les statistiques de base, sont en mesure de déclarer des données sur l'emploi et la rémunération pour des endroits particuliers.

The industrial classification of the statistics contained in this report is based on the Standard Industrial Classification for 1960. A description of the various industries and groups of industries is contained in the "Standard Industrial Classification Manual", Catalogue No. 12-501. The "S.I.C. code" columns of Tables 2, 3 and 4 correspond to the codes of this manual. These tables also contain the following groupings which are not part of the "Standard Industrial Classification Manual":

- (a) Industrial composite (031-899) It is the sum of all the industries included in the survey (see Coverage).
- (b) Durable goods manufacturing (durable) comprises wood products (250-259), furniture and fixtures (260-269), primary metal industries (290-298), metal fabricating industries (300-309), machinery except electrical (310-318), transportation equipment (320-329), electrical products (330-339), and non-metallic mineral products (340-359).
- (c) Non-durable goods manufacturing (non-dur) consists of food and beverages (100-147), tobacco processing and products (150-153), rubber products (160-169), leather products (170-179), textile products (180-229), knitting mills (230-239), clothing (240-249), paper and allied industries (270-274), printing, publishing and allied industries (280-289), petroleum and coal products (360-369), chemicals and chemical products (370-379), and miscellaneous manufacturing industries (380-399).
- (d) Building construction (404,421). It is the sum of general contractors (404) and special trade contractors (421).
- (e) Engineering construction (406,409) It includes highway, bridge and street construction (406) and other construction (409).
- (f) The synthetic textile industry (201) is sub-divided into spun yarn and fabrics (2011) and filament yarn and staple fibres (2012).
- (g) Head Offices, sales and auxiliary units This special group includes head offices, sales branches and research laboratories for the following major groups of manufacturing: food and beverages (100), rubber products (160), paper and allied industries (270), primary metal industries (290), electrical products (330), and chemicals and chemical products (370).

Geographic Classification

Reporting units are assigned to a province, a county (as defined by the Census of Population) and, where applicable, to an urban area. Data for Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick are aggregated in some tables to give statistics for the Atlantic Region. Similarly, data for Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta are added together to provide totals for the Prairie Region. The 1966 Census of Population's "Metropolitan Area" definitions were used for the nineteen applicable urban areas; the definitions used for other urban areas are based on a labour market concept. The urban areas usually consist of the urban centre as well as the surrounding territory. A list showing the territory included in each tabulated urban area is available from the Employment and

Payrolls Section. The reporting units not located in a tabulated urban area or not allocated to a compiled county, are included in provincial, regional and national totals.

Definitions

1. Reference Period

Conceptually, the data in this report refer to the last seven days in the specified month. In practice, few firms keep payroll records covering precisely this period. Therefore, firms are permitted to report for their last pay period or pay periods in each month. When the reported pay period is longer than one week, the data are reduced to a week using the number of days the firm usually operates during a week divided by the number of working days covered by the reported pay period. If, owing to strikes, holidays or other similar factors, the data for the reported period are not representative of the reference period, adjustments are made to accurately reflect the situation of the last seven days of the month.

2. Employee

All persons drawing pay for services rendered or for paid absence during the survey reference period and for whom an employer makes CPP or QPP and/or UIC contributions constitute employees.

The employee concept comprises full-time employees, part-time employees (those who regularly work fewer hours than the standard work week of the establishment), and casual employees (those who are hired for discontinuous periods or on an irregular basis and who worked at least seven hours during the reference period).

The employee concept excludes owners or partners of unincorporated businesses and professional practices, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, persons doing non-remunerative work, pensioners, home workers, members of elected or appointed bodies, military personnel and persons providing services to an establishment on a contract basis.

An employee working for a part of the reference period and unemployed or on strike for the rest is counted as employed. Persons not receiving pay for the entire reference period are excluded.

The employees are classified into two broad occupational categories, namely: salaried employees and wage-earners:

(a) Wage-earners

This group includes employees engaged in actual production and related operations, including maintenance, warehouse and delivery staffs, security staff, routemen, driver-salesmen, sales clerks in retail stores, waitresses, and working foremen performing functions similar to those of the employees whom they supervise, etc. All the above-mentioned employees are considered to be wage-earners regardless of whether their earnings are based on monthly, hourly or other rates of pay. Average weekly wages are computed for all wage-earners but average weekly hours and average hourly earnings are calculated only for wage-earners for whom hours data are available.

Définitions

1. Période de référence

En théorie, les données sur l'emploi se rapportent aux sept derniers jours du mois de référence. En pratique, étant donné que peu d'entreprises tiennent des registres de paye pour cette période précise, on leur permet de faire porter leur déclaration sur la (les) dernière(s) période(s) de paye de chaque mois. Lorsque la période de paye sur laquelle porte la déclaration dépasse une semaine, on rajuste les données en effectuant le calcul suivant: on divise le nombre de jours d'activité hebdomadaire de l'entreprise par le nombre de jours ouvrables compris dans la période de paye sur laquelle porte la déclaration. Si, en raison d'une grève, d'un jour férié ou d'autres facteurs semblables, les données déclarées ne sont pas représentatives de la période de référence, on procède aux rajustements qui s'imposent afin de traduire fidèlement la situation pendant les sept derniers jours du mois.

2. Salarié

Toute personne qui est rétribuée pour ses services ou ses absences pendant la semaine de référence et pour laquelle l'employeur verse des contributions au R.P.C. ou au R.R.Q. et à la caisse d'assurance-chômage, est un salarié.

La catégorie "salariés" comprend les salariés à temps plein, les salariés à temps partiel (ceux qui travaillent régulièrement un nombre d'heures inférieur à la semaine normale de travail de l'entreprise) et les salariés occasionnels (ceux qui sont embauchés de façon temporaire ou irrégulière et qui ont travaillé au moins sept heures au cours de la période de référence).

Le concept des salariés exclut les propriétaires et les partenaires d'entreprises non constituées en corporation et ceux qui possèdent un bureau pour l'exercice d'une profession, les travailleurs autonomes, les travailleurs familiaux non rémunérés, les bénévoles, les retraités, les travailleurs à domicile, les membres de corps élus ou nommés, le personnel militaire et les personnes fournissant des services à un établissement sur une base forfaitaire.

Sont visées les personnes qui ont travaillé pendant une partie de la période de référence mais qui étaient en chômage ou en grève pendant le reste de la période. Les personnes n'ayant pas touché de paye pour la période de référence entière ne sont pas visées.

Les salariés sont classés en deux catégories professionnelles, soit les employés et les ouvriers:

a) Ouvriers

Cette catégorie comprend les personnes travaillant effectivement à la production et à des opérations assimilées, en particulier le personnel d'entretien, d'entrepôt et de livraison, le personnel de sécurité, les chauffeurs-livreurs, les vendeurs itinérants, les commis des magasins de détail, les serveuses et les contremaîtres remplissant des fonctions analogues à celles des ouvriers dont ils ont la charge, etc. Toutes ces personnes sont considérées comme des ouvriers, que leurs gains soient fondés sur des taux de rémunération mensuels, horaires ou autres. Les salaires hebdomadaires moyens sont calculés pour tous les ouvriers, mais les heures hebdomadaires moyennes et les gains horaires moyens sont calculés uniquement pour ceux dont on connaît le nombre d'heures de travail.

(b) **Salaried Employees**

This category comprises executive, administrative, supervisory, technical and professional personnel, commission agents, and travelling salesmen directly responsible to the administration, as well as general office, clerical and related workers in the office and plant. In addition, working directors of incorporated businesses are included in this category.

b) **Employés**

Cette catégorie comprend les directeurs, les administrateurs, les surveillants, les cadres techniques et spécialisés, les agents à la commission, les voyageurs de commerce relevant directement de l'administration, ainsi que les employés de bureau, les commis et les travailleurs assimilés, au bureau et à l'usine. 3. **Earnings**

Earnings of wage-earners and salaried employees represent gross pay for the week, before deductions for taxes, unemployment insurance contributions, etc. Gross pay includes salaries, straight time wages, piece-work and regular commission earnings, regular paid incentive, cost of living and other bonuses, overtime earnings and payments to persons absent with pay in the survey reference week. The payroll concept does not include supplementary labour costs such as employers' contributions to unemployment insurance, medical plans, Workmen's Compensation and other welfare plans, nor does it include the cost of equipment, the value of room and board, compensation in kind, travelling expenses, retirement gratuities, bonuses paid at irregular and infrequent intervals or directors' fees.

The term "earnings" is used to denote the total of weekly wages of the wage-earners and salaries of the salaried employees. The publications prior to March 1971 contained these data combined under "Average Weekly Wages and Salaries". These data are comparable with "Average Weekly Earnings" of total employees in the present publication. The system now provides separate earnings data for all wage-earners and salaried employees whereas formerly only "Average Weekly Wages" for hourly-rated wage-earners were available.

4. **Paid Absence**

Paid absence comprises paid holidays, vacation, sick leave including industrial injury and personal leave such as bereavement leave, jury duty, etc.

5. **Standard Work Week**

The standard work week is the number of hours or days of work normally scheduled for the majority of full-time employees.

Methodology

The data appearing in this report were collected by means of questionnaires mailed monthly to all firms which employ 20 or more persons in any one month of the year. In order to improve the quality of data, the response rate is increased through two reminders mailed to all non-respondents one month and two months after the original mail-out. If the two reminders do not produce a response, the Field Division of Statistics Canada attempts to obtain the required data by telephone or in a personal interview. These steps result in a final response rate of over 80%. Firms for which no response is obtained are still accounted for in the employment, earnings and hours tables of this publication. To do this, the unknown figures are replaced by figures based on the behaviour of the reporting unit in the previous month and on the behaviour of reporting units which are similar with

3. **Gains**

Les gains des ouvriers et des employés représentent la rémunération brute de la semaine, avant toutes déductions d'impôt, de cotisations d'assurance-chômage, etc. La rémunération brute comprend les traitements, les salaires au taux ordinaire, les gains provenant du travail à la pièce et les commissions régulières, les primes au rendement, les primes de vie chère et autres gratifications versées régulièrement, les gains pour travail supplémentaire et les paiements versés aux personnes en congé payé pendant la semaine de référence. Le concept de rémunération ne comprend pas les frais supplémentaires de main-d'œuvre tels que les contributions de l'employeur à la caisse d'assurance-chômage, aux régimes d'assurance-maladie, à la caisse d'indemnisation des accidents du travail et à d'autres régimes de prévoyance; il ne comprend pas non plus le coût du matériel, la valeur du couvert et du gîte, les paiements en nature, les frais de déplacement, les indemnités de retraite, les gratifications versées à intervalles irréguliers et peu fréquents ni les jetons de présence des administrateurs.

Le terme "gains" désigne l'ensemble des salaires hebdomadaires des ouvriers et des traitements des employés. 4. **Absence payée**

Les absences payées comprennent les jours fériés payés, les vacances, les congés de maladie, ainsi que les congés d'accident du travail et les congés personnels tels que les congés de deuil et les congés pour fonctions de jury.

5. **Semaine normale de travail**

La semaine normale de travail est le nombre d'heures ou de jours de travail normalement prévus pour la majorité des salariés à temps plein.

Méthodologie

Les données présentées dans cette publication ont été recueillies au moyen de questionnaires postaux envoyés chaque mois à toutes les entreprises employant 20 personnes ou plus au cours d'un mois donné de l'année. respect to industrial classification, size and geographic location and which have responded for the month in question.

1. Data Edit

All the completed questionnaires which reach Statistics Canada are carefully edited for completeness, consistency and accuracy both manually and using computer edit procedures. To perform the computerized edit, the responses are assembled into imputation groups which are formed on the basis of industrial classification, geographic area and size of the reporting unit. The composition of these groups is such that they consist of reporting units which behave similarly with respect to the characteristics being measured and with respect to relationships between these characteristics. This edit compares the value of a characteristic (number of employees, hours worked, salary per employee, the ratio of the present number of employees to last month's number of employees, etc.) to the corresponding value of the characteristic for the whole imputation group. The amount by which a characteristic is allowed to vary from the average imputation group value is calculated separately for each group and for each characteristic and depends on the homogeneity and stability of the group itself.

When a figure varies too much from the average value for the imputation group, it is replaced by a value which is at the maximum variance allowed by the computer edit. It is not always possible to find a value within the allowable limit of the computer edit; in such case, the figure is replaced by an imputed value.

This procedure may, in rare occasions, result in changing a figure which was actually correct. This is a small penalty to be paid for a mechanical procedure which detects efficiently many significant errors such as misplaced decimal points, mistakes in recording of data and problems due to misunderstanding of definitions or instructions.

2. Imputation

Every month, there are reporting units for which response or a partial response is received and units whose reports fail edits but cannot be corrected by automatic procedures. Some or all the data for those units are imputed. This means that the incorrect or unknown characteristics are replaced by values derived from the other characteristics in the report, from the firm's report of the previous month and from the behaviour of the imputation group to which the firm belongs.

Imputation is used on about 4% of the reports each month. As in the case of automatic error correction, it is possible for a value which is actually correct to be replaced by another value. However, it is more often that an erroneous or non-existent figure is replaced by a figure which is closer to the true value and which is based on the firm's report from the previous month and on the reports of firms in a similar industry, size range and geographic location.

Reliability of the Estimates

Because the Monthly Employment, Payrolls and Manhours survey is a census, any inaccuracy in the results is due to non-sampling error. Some of the factors contributing to non-sampling error are the inability to obtain responses from all in-scope reporting units, incorrect responses supplied by respondents and mistakes in recording,

1. Vérification des données

Tous les questionnaires remplis renvoyés à Statistique Canada sont soigneusement vérifiés à la main et par ordinateur pour assurer qu'ils sont complets, cohérents et exacts. Pour être vérifiées par ordinateur, les réponses sont réparties en groupes d'imputation constitués en fonction du classement par activité économique, du lieu géographique et de la taille de l'unité déclarante. La composition de ces groupes est telle qu'ils regroupent des unités déclarantes qui présentent les mêmes caractéristiques et dont les caractéristiques affichent les mêmes liens entre elles. Cette vérification permet de comparer la valeur d'une caractéristique (nombre de salariés, heures de travail, gains par salarié, rapport du nombre actuel de salariés à celui du mois précédent, etc.) par rapport à la valeur de la caractéristique correspondante pour tout le groupe d'imputation. Lorsqu'un chiffre s'écarte trop de la valeur moyenne pour tout le groupe d'imputation, on le remplace par une valeur qui comporte la variance maximum permise par la vérification par ordinateur. Il n'est pas toujours possible de trouver une valeur qui se situe à l'intérieur de la limite permise par l'ordinateur; si tel est le cas, on remplace le chiffre par une valeur imputée.

Il arrive, en de rares occasions, que ce procédé se solde par la modification induite d'un chiffre qui était exact au départ. Cela n'est pas trop grave si l'on considère que ce procédé mécanique permet de détecter efficacement un grand nombre d'erreurs graves comme des points décimaux mal placés, des erreurs d'inscription des données et des problèmes attribuables à une mauvaise interprétation des définitions ou des instructions.

2. Imputation

Chaque mois, on reçoit une réponse complète ou partielle de certaines unités déclarantes, alors que d'autres renvoient des questionnaires qui sont rejetés à la vérification et qui ne peuvent être corrigés à la machine. Une partie ou la totalité des données pour ces unités doivent donc être imputées. Cela signifie que les caractéristiques incorrectes ou inconnues sont remplacées par des valeurs calculées en fonction d'autres caractéristiques de la même déclaration de l'entreprise, de sa déclaration du mois précédent et des caractéristiques du groupe d'imputation auquel elle appartient.

On effectue une imputation pour environ 4% des déclarations chaque mois. Comme dans le cas de la correction automatique des erreurs, il est possible qu'une valeur exacte au départ soit remplacée par une autre. Toutefois, il arrive plus souvent qu'un chiffre erroné ou non existant soit remplacé par un chiffre plus proche de la valeur réelle et fondé sur la déclaration de l'entreprise du mois précédent et sur celles d'entreprises qui font partie d'une branche d'activité semblable, appartiennent au même groupe de taille et sont situées dans le même lieu géographique.

Fiabilité des estimations

L'enquête sur l'emploi, la rémunération et les heures-hommes étant une enquête exhaustive, toute inexactitude dans les résultats est attribuable à une erreur d'observation. Parmi les exemples de sources d'erreurs d'observation, citons l'impossibilité d'obtenir des renseignements de toutes les unités de l'échantillon, les renseignements inexacts fournis par les

coding and processing of the data. Non-sampling errors are difficult to measure and no estimates of this type of error have been obtained for this survey as yet. However, non-sampling errors have been kept to a minimum by the use of a carefully designed and carefully worded questionnaire, the relative simplicity of the data requested, follow-up of non-respondents, thorough editing of data and control of the processing operations.

Statistical Presentation

1. Data Revision

Each month, statistics for three latest months are prepared by the Employment and Payrolls Section. Data for the first, most current month, are entitled first estimates. They are based on a limited number of returns (usually about 55%) and only highly aggregated figures are released in the Statistics Canada *Daily* and the First Estimates table of this publication. Simultaneously, second estimates are prepared for the month immediately preceding the most current data and third estimates for the month prior to that. Both of these latter estimates are of course, of higher quality than that of the first estimates because of the higher rate of returns (approximately 75% and 82% respectively). Consequently, full details for both of these months are shown in this publication.

After completion of the third estimate, revisions to the data are made occasionally to incorporate larger corrections originating from late returns and corrected information received from respondents or to rectify mechanical errors. These corrections appear in the tables of this publication.

2. Index Numbers

Index numbers are calculated by dividing the current month's employment (or payroll) by the monthly - average of the total base year employment (or payroll).

The index numbers constitute a better measure of the monthly trends in statistical series than the actual values because they are not affected by certain statistical changes. For example, a large firm erroneously missing from the survey can be introduced by adjusting both the current and base year data and, thus, will not distort the monthly changes indicated by the index numbers. However, the measure of the monthly trend calculated from the actual value will be biased because the additions which should be reflected in all months are only included from the time the correction is made.

3. Averages

The average weekly hours figure is obtained by dividing total weekly man-hours by the number of wage-earners who worked those hours. Average hourly earnings are obtained by dividing total weekly wages of hourly-rated wage-earners by their total weekly hours. Both of these averages apply only to the subset of wage-earners for whom hourly details are reported. It should be noted that total hours include overtime hours actually worked and that the wage-earners total includes part-time wage-earners and casuals working more than seven hours during the survey reference week.

Présentation statistique

1. Révision des données

Chaque mois, la Section des statistiques de l'emploi et de la rémunération prépare des statistiques pour les trois derniers mois. Les données du premier mois, le mois le plus récent, sont appelées "premières estimations". Elles sont fondées sur un nombre limité de déclarations (habituellement environ 55%) et seuls des chiffres très généraux sont publiés dans le *Quotidien* de Statistique Canada et dans le tableau "Premières estimations" de la présente publication. En même temps, la Section prépare des deuxième estimations pour le mois qui précède le mois le plus récent, et des troisième pour le mois qui précède celui-là. Bien entendu, ces deux dernières estimations sont de meilleure qualité que les premières en raison de l'obtention d'un plus grand nombre de réponses (environ 75% pour les deuxième estimations et 82% pour les troisième). Par conséquent, la présente publication contient tous les détails pour ces deux mois.

Une fois terminées les troisième estimations, on modifie à l'occasion les données à la lumière de révisions plus importantes effectuées pour tenir compte des déclarations des retardataires et des rectifications reçues des entreprises enquêtées, ou par suite de la correction de certaines erreurs mécaniques. Les modifications apportées figurent dans les tableaux de la présente publication.

2. Nombres-indices

On obtient les nombres-indices en divisant le nombre total de salariés (ou la rémunération) du mois courant par la moyenne mensuelle du nombre de salariés (ou de la rémunération) de l'année de base.

Les nombres-indices constituent une mesure plus valable des tendances mensuelles observées dans les séries statistiques que les valeurs réelles, car ils ne sont pas touchés par certaines variations statistiques. Par exemple, on peut introduire dans l'enquête une grande entreprise qu'on a oublié de dénombrer lors du listage en rajustant à la fois les données de l'année courante et celles de l'année de base et, ainsi, éviter de fausser les variations mensuelles affichées par les nombres-indices. Toutefois, toute mesure de la tendance mensuelle calculée à partir de la valeur réelle comportera un biais, car les ajouts qui devraient être faits pour tous les mois ne sont effectués qu'à partir du moment où la correction est apportée.

3. Moyennes

On calcule les heures hebdomadaires moyennes en divisant le nombre hebdomadaire total d'heures-hommes par le nombre d'ouvriers qui ont fait ces heures. On obtient les gains horaires moyens en divisant le salaire hebdomadaire total des ouvriers rémunérés à l'heure par le nombre total d'heures de travail qu'ils ont fait par semaine. Ces deux moyennes s'appliquent seulement aux ouvriers dont le nombre d'heures est déclaré. Il convient de remarquer que le nombre total d'heures comprend les heures supplémentaires réelles et que le nombre total d'ouvriers comprend les ouvriers à temps partiel et occasionnels qui ont travaillé plus de sept heures pendant la semaine de référence.

4. Seasonal Adjustment

Fluctuations in economic time series are caused by seasonal, cyclical and irregular movements. A seasonally-adjusted series is one from which seasonal movements have been eliminated. Seasonal movements are defined as those which are caused by regular annual events such as climate, crop cycles, holidays and vacation periods. It should be noted that the seasonally-adjusted series contains irregular as well as long-term cyclical fluctuations.

The X-11 variant of the U.S. *Census Method II* is used to seasonally adjust the data. This seasonal adjustment system is a complex computer program which differentiates between the seasonal trend and the irregular movements in a series over a number of years and, on the basis of past movements, estimates appropriate seasonal factors for current data. On an annual basis the entire historical series of seasonally-adjusted data is revised in light of the most recent information on changes in seasonality.

This system is used to calculate the seasonally-adjusted employment index numbers, and the average weekly hours and average hourly earnings for selected statistical series. Additional seasonally-adjusted series may be found in "Employment, earnings and hours, seasonally-adjusted series, January 1961 - December 1971" (Catalogue 72-206).

5. Confidentiality

The information presented in this publication has been reviewed to ensure that the confidentiality of individual responses is respected.

4. Désaisonnalisation

Les fluctuations des séries chronologiques économiques sont causées par des mouvements saisonniers, cycliques et irréguliers. Une série désaisonnalisée est une série dont on a éliminé les effets des mouvements saisonniers. Les mouvements saisonniers sont ceux qui sont causés par des événements annuels réguliers comme les changements de température, les cycles agricoles, les jours fériés et les vacances. Il convient de noter que la série désaisonnalisée contient des fluctuations irrégulières ainsi que des fluctuations cycliques à long terme.

La variante X-11 de la *Method II* de désaisonnalisation du *U.S. Bureau of the Census* est utilisée pour désaisonnaliser. Ce système permet de déceler les mouvements saisonniers, tendanciels et irréguliers au cours d'une période de plusieurs années et, à la lumière des mouvements passés, d'estimer les coefficients saisonniers appropriés pour l'année en cours. Sur une base annuelle, toute la série chronologique des données désaisonnalisées est révisée à la lumière des renseignements les plus récents sur les changements de saisonnalité.

Ce système est utilisé pour calculer les nombres-indices désaisonnalisés de l'emploi, ainsi que les heures hebdomadaires moyennes et les gains horaires moyens pour certaines séries statistiques. Vous trouverez d'autres séries désaisonnalisées dans le bulletin *Emploi, rémunération et heures, séries désaisonnalisées, janvier 1961 - décembre 1971*, numéro 72-206 au catalogue.


