



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
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
AVERAGE HOURLY EARNINGS IN MANUFACTURING

Canada

Manufacturing.- Average hourly earnings of hourly-rated wage-earners in manufacturing rose by 1.2 cents between Sept. 1 and Oct. 1, to a new maximum of 153.3 cents. The average work week, at 41.5 hours, was the longest reported since Dec. 1, 1955. The average weekly wages were the highest on record, at \$63.62.

Wage-earners in factories manufacturing durable goods earned 166.3 cents per hour at Oct. 1, 1.9 cents more than a month earlier. The work week rose by 0.6 hours to 41.8, and the average weekly wages were \$1.78 more. Earnings mounted in all major branches of the group. Higher wage rates in primary iron and steel, non-ferrous metal smelters, brass and copper and some other industries accounted for part of the gain, while a generally higher level of activity in many establishments also contributed. Employment and earnings in the automotive industry returned to more usual levels following the dislocation caused by model change-over reported at Sept. 1. Agricultural implement factories further reduced their wage-earners, but the average earnings were a little higher, and the work week longer. Industrial disputes affected some branches of the iron and steel group.

Average hours and earnings in non-durable goods manufacturing showed moderate gains, although the employment of large numbers of seasonal workers in canning factories caused the earnings to fall slightly below those reported at July 1 and Aug. 1. Wage-rate increases in meat packing, boot and shoe factories, chemicals and some other industries contributed to the upward movement at Oct. 1, when overtime in printing and publishing and other establishments was also a factor.

Non-Manufacturing Industries.- Average hourly earnings in all major branches of the mining group rose at Oct. 1. Higher pay rates in the nickel-copper group, a seasonal decline in employment of lower-paid workers in the peat industry, and a longer work week in coal mining in Alberta were among the more important changes.

The number of wage-earners was lower than at Sept. 1 in both main branches of construction, in which the averages of hours and earnings rose. In hotels and restaurants, average earnings were higher, with the release of lower-paid seasonal help in summer hotels.

Provinces

Average hourly earnings of factory wage-earners were higher in all provinces at Oct. 1 than at Sept. 1. With the exception of Saskatchewan, average weekly wages were also higher. The hours worked per person rose in most provinces, Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Saskatchewan and Alberta being the exceptions. In six provinces, the average hourly earnings reached an all-time high in the week of Oct. 1.


Lay-off of lower-paid help in fish processing and in fruit and vegetable canning accounted for much of the gain in the averages in the Atlantic provinces. Overtime in shipyards in Nova Scotia contributed to higher earnings in manufacturing in that province.

In Quebec, the number of seasonal workers in canneries dropped, resulting in higher average earnings in the food and beverage group. There were wage-rate increases in boot and shoe factories, chemical plants and some other establishments, while longer hours and higher production bonuses in transportation equipment and iron and steel contributed to the general gain in manufacturing.

A substantial increase in employment and hours in canneries lowered the group average of earnings in food and beverages in Ontario. However, higher wage-rates in some establishments in the iron and steel, transportation equipment and non-ferrous metal industries, together with the resumption of more normal activity in automotive factories following a partial shut-down

for model change-over, resulted in an all-over gain of 0.4 cents in average hourly earnings in manufacturing. The average hours worked rose in many of the more important industries to the highest point since May 1. Both average hourly and weekly earnings in manufacturing as a whole in this province reached a new maximum.

Wage-rate increases in meat-packing plants, accelerated activity in transportation equipment, and higher cost-of-living bonuses in some industries were responsible for gains in average hours and earnings in Manitoba. Overtime in printing and publishing contributed to a slight rise in average hourly earnings in manufacturing in Saskatchewan. Hours and earnings in meat packing, however, were somewhat lower than at Sept. 1. In Alberta, higher pay rates in iron and steel, overtime in oil refineries and greater activity in transportation equipment and some other classes brought average hourly and weekly earnings in manufacturing to a new maximum. The employment of seasonal workers in sugar refineries for a few days during the period under review lowered the average work week in the food and beverage group.

In British Columbia, fish and fruit canneries released part of their lower-paid seasonal staffs, resulting in higher averages of earnings. Other factors contributing to a gain in factory earnings generally were increased activity in pulp and paper, saw and planing mills, and shipyards.

Metropolitan Areas

Monthly hours and earnings data in the third quarter of 1956 for 23 smaller cities appear in Table 3 of this bulletin. The situation in these centres during the period was affected by such factors as vacations and seasonal and other changes in employment distributions between relatively high pay and low pay industries, which contribute to variations in average earnings and hours.

Table 3, giving statistics for 13 larger metropolitan areas, shows higher average hourly earnings in manufacturing at Oct. 1 than at Sept. 1 in most centres. The exceptions were London, where the earnings were unchanged, and Quebec, Ottawa-Hull, and Windsor, where they declined. The average work week was longer except in St. Catharines, in which there was no change from the preceding figure, and London, where the hours were slightly lower. With the exception of Ottawa-Hull and London, the average weekly wages were higher.

A small decrease in average hourly earnings in Quebec resulted from a rise in hours and wage-earners in industries employing large numbers of women, with a shorter work week in paper products, where earnings are above the general average. Heightened activity in the heavy industries accounted for higher earnings in manufacturing in Montreal and Toronto. Small declines in employment and earnings in pulp and paper were mainly responsible for reduced earnings in Ottawa-Hull. The changes recorded in St. Catharines and Windsor were due to variations in levels of activity in the motor vehicle and parts industry, caused by model changeover. Wage increases and industrial disputes also affected the figures in those two centres. Upward adjustments in wage rates in the iron and steel group and in chemicals were important factors in the increase in manufacturing in Hamilton. A decline in female help in electrical apparatus manufacturing, and a somewhat longer work week in agricultural implements factories contributed importantly to the upward movement of hours and earnings in manufacturing in Brantford. Increased hours and higher earnings in transportation equipment raised the general level of earnings in Winnipeg and Edmonton. Wage-rate increases in meat-packing plants, were also a factor, particularly in Winnipeg. In Vancouver, a longer average work week in wood products and overtime in shipyards accounted for part of a gain of 2.3 cents in average hourly earnings in manufacturing. Lay-offs of lower-paid seasonal help in fruit canneries also contributed.

Note:- An explanation of the method used in computing the statistics of real wages as shown in Columns 2 and 4 appeared in the 1952 Annual Review of Man-Hours and Hourly Earnings.

Although calculations of real wages may reflect the experience of groups of workers fairly well, it should be noted that their dependability, particularly as they apply to individual wage-earners, rests upon certain important qualifications. Substantial variations within the group, such as marked changes in the proportions of men and women, or important shifts of employment between higher or lower paid areas, industries and occupations which may affect the wage averages, will in turn influence the real earnings series. Further, should important changes in spending habits occur in the interval, the estimates of change in real earnings are likely to be less reliable. The latter qualification is of particular importance over long periods of time.

It should also be kept in mind that measures of change in real earnings calculated from averages of gross earnings may differ from changes in the purchasing power of "take-home" pay, due to such factors as changes in personal income tax, and pay deductions for such things as social insurance and pension plans. Thus index numbers of real wages should not be interpreted as measuring fluctuations in the level of consumption of wage-earners or wage-earners' families; they are intended to show only the trend in purchasing power of wages over the items covered by the price index, and, in addition to the factors already mentioned, do not take into account other family income or changes in the savings position of families.

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NOTES

General.— The monthly statistics of average hours, average hourly earnings and average weekly wages, like those of employment, payrolls and average weekly wages and salaries, are based on data from establishments usually employing 15 persons and over. Statistics for the latest month are subject to revision.

Coverage.— Firms are asked to furnish information for the male and female wage-earners for whom they keep records of hours worked, so that the statistics relate, in the main, to hourly-rated wage-earners, or production workers, employed full time and part time. Casual workers are also included. Data for salaried personnel are purposely excluded. In many cases, information is not available for certain classes of wage-earners, whose earnings, like those of most salaried employees, are not directly dependent on the number of hours worked; examples of wage-earners frequently excluded are route-drivers, piece-workers in many but not all establishments, truck men, etc. Numerous employers do not keep record of man-hours for any classes of employees. The number of workers for whom information is given in the present report is therefore smaller than the total number of workers (wage-earners and salaried employees) for whom statistics of employment, payrolls, average earnings, sex distribution, etc., are given in the monthly bulletins on employment and payrolls. These contain a fuller explanation of the monthly data on employment, payrolls and man-hours.

In manufacturing, largely represented in the statistics of this report, the data relate to over 74 p.c. of all employees on the staffs of the firms co-operating in the monthly surveys of employment and payrolls; in 1951, the wage-earners for whom information on man-hours was obtained formed over 81 p.c. of the total number of wage-earners reported by practically all manufacturing establishments to the Annual Census of Manufactures, including hourly-rated and other wage-earners. In mining and construction, data on man-hours and hourly earnings are provided for approximately 78 p.c. and 72 p.c.

of the total employees of firms co-operating in the monthly surveys of employment and payrolls in those industries, respectively; in 1948, the monthly statistics were based on approximately 89 p.c. and 54 p.c. of the total number of wage-earners reported to the Census of Mining and Census of Construction, respectively.

Man-Hours.— The statistics of man-hours include hours worked by full-time and part-time wage-earners, including overtime hours actually worked; premium or penalty hours credited for purposes of computing over-time payment are not included. Hours credited to wage-earners absent on leave with pay in the reported pay periods are included in the statistics as though the hours had been worked. The averages are obtained by dividing the aggregate hours reported for the week by the number of full-time and part-time wage-earners working such hours.

Wages.— The questionnaire calls for a statement of gross wages earned by the full-time and part-time wage-earners whose hours are reported, before deductions are made for taxes, unemployment insurance contributions, etc. Payments for overtime work, incentive or production, and cost-of-living bonuses paid at regular intervals, and amounts credited to wage-earners on leave with pay in the reported pay periods are included. The value of board and lodging, which in some cases is part of the remuneration of workers, is not included. Retroactive pay not earned during the reported pay period, and bonuses paid at infrequent intervals are also excluded.

Pay Periods.— Statistics of man-hours and wages reported for periods exceeding one week in duration are reduced by the appropriate proportions to calculate the number of hours and the wages in one week in the stated pay period. Such data are combined with weekly figures furnished by employers whose records are maintained on a weekly basis, so that, in all cases, the tabulated statistics represent the situation in one week in each month.

FOOTNOTES

The following footnotes explain the content of various industrial classes listed in the detailed tables in this bulletin. In some industries, the group breakdown is less extensive than in the Standard Industrial Classification; in these cases, figures for certain categories not shown are contained in the group totals.

- (a) Alluvial gold and auriferous quartz mining.
- (b) Copper-gold-silver; iron; nickel-copper; silver-cobalt; silver-lead-zinc and miscellaneous metal mining.
- (c) Non-metal mining and quarrying; clay and sand pits.
- (d) Miscellaneous wood products.
- (e) Paper boxes and bags; roofing papers; miscellaneous paper products.
- (f) Household, office and store machinery; machine tools; machinery, n.e.s.
- (g) Abrasives; asbestos; hydraulic cement; clay; glass; lime and gypsum; stone; concrete and miscellaneous non-metallic mineral products.
- (h) Buildings and structures; other construction; special trade contractors.
- (i) Interurban bus and coach and urban and suburban transportation systems; taxi-cab and truck transportation; services incidental to transportation; other transportation.
- (j) Hotels and restaurants; laundries, dyeing, cleaning and pressing plants, and recreational services.
