FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1963.

INTRODUCTION

Employees of the Government of Canada, including its corporations and agencies totalled 338,330 at the end of October 1963, a decrease of 4,258 or 1.2 p.c. from September 1963 and of 2,236 or 0.7 p.c. from October 1962.

Total earnings of these employees amounted to \$137,143,000 for October 1963, an increase of \$2,566,000 from September 1963 and an increase of \$5,852,000 from October 1962.

The decrease in staff strength is reflected in four out of the five types of federal organizations, with proprietary corporations accounting for four-fifths of the decline.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies had a staff strength of 135,991 at the end of October 1963, a decrease of 3,559 or 2.6 p.c. from September 1963 and of 3,901 or 2.8 p.c. from October 1962. The decrease in employees is mainly attributable to the Canadian National Railways, Northern Transportation Company Limited, and Trans-Canada Air Lines.

Earnings of these employees amounted to \$59,669,000 for October 1963, up \$1,393,000 from September 1963 and \$699,000 from October 1962. The increase in October 1963 over the previous month is accounted for mainly by the Canadian National Railways resulting from more working days compared with the preceding month.

PART B. - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

Employees in Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations at the end of October 1963 totalled 202,339, a decrease of 699 or 0.3 p.c. from September 1963 but an increase of 1,665 or 0.8 p.c. from October 1963.

Total earnings of these employees amounted to \$77,474,000 for October 1963 as compared with \$76,300,000 for September 1963 and \$72,322,000 for October 1962.

The principal variations in staff strength, by function, for the month of October 1963, when compared with the previous month, are outlined in the following table.


