FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

JULY 1963

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1963.

INTRODUCTION:

Employees of the Government of Canada, including its corporations and agencies, totalled 350,-476 at the end of July 1963, an increase of 5,675 or 1.6 p.c. over June 1963, but a decrease of 6,145 or 1.7 p.c. from July 1962.

Total earnings of these employees for July 1963 aggregated \$153,091,000, an increase of \$21,-613,000 over the previous month, and of \$17,748,000 over July 1962.

The increase in staff over the previous month is largely attributable to a general seasonal upsweep in all five reporting groups.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

The Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies had a total 141,611 employees at the end of July 1963 as compared with 138,463 in June 1963, and 145,511 in July 1962. This indicates an increase of 3,148 or 2.3 p.c. over the previous month, but a decrease of 3,900 or 2.7 p.c. from July a year earlier. The increase over June is mostly attributable to the Canadian National Railways.

Earnings of these employees amounted to \$63,160,000 in July 1963, an increase of \$6,299,000 over the previous month, and of \$2,452,000 over July 1962. The increased earnings over the prior month are principally accounted for by larger staff and extra working days and pay periods.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Statistics indicate a staff strength of 208,865 at the end of July 1963, up 2,527 or 1.2 p.c. over the preceding month, but down 2,245 or 1.1 p.c. from July 1962. Total earnings of these employees aggregated \$89,932,000, an increase of \$15,316,000 or 20.5 p.c. over June 1963 mostly accounted for by the inclusion of retroactive salary increases to certain salaried groups of employees.


