NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1963.

INTRODUCTION

The Government of Canada, including its corporations and agencies, had a staff strength of 348,510 at the end of August 1963, reflecting a decrease of 1,966 or 0.6 p.c. from July 1963, and of 3,341 or 1.0 p.c. from August a year earlier.

Total earnings for these employees amounted to \$137,740,000 for August 1963, down \$15,351,000 from the previous month, but up \$3,144,000 over August 1962.

The August 1963 decrease in total earnings is largely due to the fact that the July 1963 report included approximately \$12,000,000 in retroactive salary increases to employees in Departments and Departmental Corporations.

PART A. - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES

Employees of Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies numbered 141,921 at the end of August, 1963. This represents a very slight increase over the previous month, but a decrease of 2,653 or 1.8 p.c. from August 1962.

Earnings of these employees aggregated \$60,081,000 in August 1963, compared with \$63,160,000 in July 1963 and \$60,406,000 in the like month a year earlier. Trans-Canada Air Lines and the Canadian National Railways accounted for most of the decrease, mainly as a result of one less pay period and one less working day in August.

PART B. - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS

The reorganization of a number of departments and the formation of new ones was announced recently. For more details refer to Table 8. Some Ships' Officers and Crews of the Department of Public Works not previously reported are included for the first time, involving 107 employees with total earnings of \$40,201 for August 1963.

Employees in Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations totalled 206,589, down 2,276 or 1.1 p.c. from July 1963, and 688 or 0.3 p.c. from August 1962. Total earnings of these employees for the months being reviewed, aggregated \$77,659,000; \$89,932,000 and \$74,190,000, respectively. The substantial earnings decrease for August 1963 is mainly due to the fact that the previous month's figure included approximately \$12,000,000 in retroactive salary increases for certain groups of salaried employees.

The principal variations in staff strength, by function, for the month of August, when compared with a month earlier, are outlined in the following table:
