NOTE TO ANALYSTS

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1963.

INTRODUCTION:

Employees of the Government of Canada, including its corporations and agencies totalled 332,-767 at the end of January 1964. This represents a decrease of 1,261 or 0.4 p.c. from December 1963 and an increase of 2,477 or 0.7 p.c. from January of last year.

Total earnings for the month of January 1964 amounted to \$135,003,000, a decrease of \$2,690,000 or 2.0 p.c. from December 1963.

The decline in staff strength and earnings from December 1963 occurred mainly in the proprietary corporations.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

Employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies totalled 130,974 at the end of January 1964, representing a decrease of 1,046 or 0.8 p.c. from December 1963.

Earnings of employees in the group amounted to \$57,218,000 in January 1964, down \$2,961,000 from December 1963.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Employees in Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations totalled 201,793 at the end of January 1964, a decrease of 215 or 0.1 p.c.

Total earnings of these employees amounted to \$77,784,000 at the end of January 1964, an increase of \$270,000 from December 1963. The indicated decrease of \$12.1 million from January 1963 occurred because payroll in the earlier month included \$15.8 million in retroactive payments resulting from increases to certain salaried employees.


