OCTOBER 1964

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series was given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1964.

INTRODUCTION:

Civilian employees of the Government of Canada, including its corporations and agencies, totalled 342,416 at the end of October 1964. This represented a decrease of 1.7 p.c. from September, but an increase of 1.2 p.c. over October 1963.

Gross earnings of these employees amounted to \$143.6 million in October 1964, 9.3 p.c. or \$14.7 million below the previous month's total of \$158.2 million. The September total included salary revisions of \$9.8 million, retroactive to October 1, 1963. Comparable earnings for October 1963 were \$137.1 million, 4.7 p.c. or \$6.4 million below the month under review.

Aggregate earnings for the period January 1 to October 31, 1964 were \$1,413 million compared to \$1,354 million for the same period in 1963. This was an increase of \$59.7 million. Just over one billion dollars was paid to employees between April 1 and October 31, 1964. This was \$53.2 million above the earnings for the same six months of 1963.

The quarterly statement of hirings and separations data covering salaried employees in the third quarter of 1964 is given in Table 10 of this issue with textual commentary on page 26.

OCTOBER 1964

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

Staff strength in this group was 138,281 at the end of October. This was down 3.6 p.c. from September 30, but up 1.7 p.c. from the end of October 1963.

Gross earnings for the month amounted to \$62.9 million. This was 8.3 p.c. or \$5.7 million lower than the September total but 5.4 p.c. or \$3.2 million above October 1963. The September to October decrease reflected reduced Canadian National Railways payroll. On the other hand twenty-seven of the organizations comprising Part A, reported increases in their October 1964 versus October 1963 payrolls.

OCTOBER 1964

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Employees in this departmental group totalled 204,135 at the end of October, slightly less than for the previous month, but 1,796 more than in October 1963.

Regular earnings, at \$79.1 million, were slightly higher than for September, and 3.8 p.c. above the October 1963 earnings of \$76.2 million. Total employee earnings on the other hand were 10.0 p.c. or \$9.0 million below those for September. This difference reflects the inclusion in the September publication of retroactive payments made to salaried employees as mentioned in the introductory text.

The principal month-to-month variations in staff strength, by function, are shown below.

Third quarter 1964

Notes and Definitions:

This table is published four times a year, in the January, April, July and October issues of this publication.

The table shows for the three month period, by department and sex:

- (a) Average employment
- (b) Monthly average (pertaining to hirings and separations)
- (c) Monthly rate per 1,000 employees (pertaining to hirings and separations)

Owing to the fact that relatively small changes in the staff of small departments can result in erratic fluctuations in the hiring and separation rates, such rates are not shown for "departments" with less than 100 employees (indicated by --). The average hired and separated, as well as the average employment, are shown for the use of any person wishing to calculate such rates. However, aggregates for these departments are given in "Total-Departments with less than 100 employees", as well as in "Total-All Departments".

When using this table the following points should be remembered:

- "Hiring" means the appointment of a person to an Act position. Movements within a department are not considered as hirings.
- 2. "Separation" means the termination of service of an employee in the reporting "department" by leaving the Government Service or by transferring to another "department". Movements within a "department" are not considered as separations.
- 3. "Department", for this table only, is altered to include departmental branches or services having a separately administered personnel office.

Comments:

Most of the variations indicated in this summary recur annually. Some projects were started in the second quarter (spring season) and completed in the third quarter (July to September). Comments appear below on the most notable changes.

The Social Welfare Division of the Department of Ctizenship and Immigration had considerable increase in both hirings and separations over the April-June period. The Indian Affairs Branch of this division enters into contracts with teachers. These contracts commence September 1 and expire August 31, thus causing simultaneous hirings and separations. The Education Division of Northern Administration in the Department of Northern Affairs and National Resources recorded similar variations in teaching staff.

Although integration of the armed forces in the Department of National Defence is causing a decrease in civilian personnel, other variations occur with seasonal staff. During the summer the department commences to hire fireman-labourers and heating plant staff for the coming winter months. This contributed to the rise in hirings from the second to the third quarter.

The Field and Air Surveys, Mapping and Aeronautical Charting Branch of Mines and Technical Surveys witnessed above average hirings because of two events:

- 1. The Air Photo Production Unit was transferred from National Defence. Although the transfer was official April 1, 1964, it did not take place before July.
- 2. The Map Compilation and Reproduction Unit was expanded.
