FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT

MARCH 1964

NOTE

A complete description of the method of collection and the statistics included in this series is given, together with other background detail, in the report for April 1963.

INTRODUCTION:

Employees of the Government of Canada, including all of its corporations and agencies, totalled 332,660 on March 31, 1964. This represents an increase of 229 from the end of February 1964 and an increase of 4,020 or 1.2 per cent from March 31 of 1963.

Total employee earnings for March 1964 amounted to \$136,694,000, an increase of \$4,581,000 or 3.5 per cent over February and of \$10,421,000 or 8.3 per cent over March of last year.

In the fiscal year April 1, 1963 to March 31, 1964 staff earnings amounted to \$1,631 millions compared with \$1,568 millions in the year ended March 31, 1963.

PART A - AGENCY AND PROPRIETARY CORPORATIONS AND OTHER AGENCIES:

Employees in Agency and Proprietary Corporations and Other Agencies totalled 130,760 at the end of March 1964 as compared to 130,755 for February 1964 and 129,819 for March 1963.

Earnings of employees in this group amounted to \$57,885,000 in March 1964, up \$2,821,000 or 5.1 per cent from the previous month and up \$4,115,000 or 7.7 per cent from March 1963. The increase in employee earnings during this month is accounted for mainly by the Canadian National Railways.

Fiscal year comparison show that the payroll total of \$698.7 millions in the year ended March 31, 1964 were 3.1 per cent higher than the \$678.0 millions in the twelve months ended March 31, 1963.

PART B - DEPARTMENTAL BRANCHES, SERVICES AND CORPORATIONS:

Employees in Departmental Branches, Services and Corporations totalled 201,900 at the end of March 1964, an increase of 224 over February 1964 and 3,079 over March 1963.

Earnings of this group aggregated \$78,808,000 in March 1964, up \$1,760,000 or 2.3 per cent from March 1963.

Salary revisions were announced for 7,000 professionals effective July 1, 1963. These employees had increases of \$1.8 millions for the period July 1963 to the end of February 1964. This amount has been included in Table 3B under "Retroactive payments reported". Regular earnings for March 1964 include the revised salaries for that month.

Total payroll for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1964 totalled \$932.4 millions, up \$42.3 millions or 4.8 per cent from the comparable figure for the previous fiscal year.
